SB 910 – Court-ordered Treatment Programs

This bill also amends s. 394.47891, F.S., adding "individuals who are current or former United States Department of Defense contractors; and individuals who are current or former military members of a foreign allied country" to those eligible to participate in the "Military Veterans and Servicemembers Court Program under which veterans... who are charged or convicted of a criminal offense, and who suffer from a military-related mental illness, traumatic brain injury, substance abuse disorder, or psychological problem can be sentenced in accordance with chapter 921 in a manner that appropriately addresses the severity of the mental illness, traumatic brain injury, substance abuse disorder, or psychological problem through services tailored to the individual needs of the participant." Additionally, it further expands the pool by adding veterans who were discharged or released under "any condition," whereas under current law a general discharge was the only additional type of discharge included.

Per DOC, in FY 17-18, there were 148 offenders admitted for veterans' treatment intervention. It is not known how many more eligible offenders there would be under this new language, so the number of offenders diverted from prison cannot be quantified.
