# Education Estimating Conference on Student Financial Aid EXECUTIVE SUMMARY July 13, 2016

The Student Financial Aid Estimating Conference met on July 13, 2016, to review FY 2015-16 projected actual awards and to adopt estimates for FY 2016-17 through FY 2021-22. For FY 2015-16, the projected actual awards were within +/- 1 percent of the December estimate for all programs, and are used as the baseline for FY 2016-17 and subsequent year projections. At the direction of the Conference, the Department of Education will develop estimates for all years of the forecast period beginning with the Fall 2016 estimating conference.

Bright Futures Scholarships: In FY 2015-16, renewal awards were lower than expected, as was the average number of credit hours, which reduced the total cost by \$9.0 million compared to the previous estimate. For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted 101,220 total awards including 25,665 initial awards and 75,555 renewals. The initial awards estimate includes 653 additional awards associated with the change in scoring for the SAT exam. The renewal awards estimate is an average of the two estimates that were presented. Although the number of awards increased over the prior estimate, the total cost is reduced because of lower average credit hours. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted 98,105 total awards, including 31,573 initial awards and 66,532 renewal awards. The initial awards estimate includes 5,566 additional awards associated with the new SAT scoring and is also adjusted to reflect a minimum SAT score of 1180 for the FMS program, pursuant to section 1009.531(6)(c), Florida Statutes.

Florida Resident Access Grants (FRAG): For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted **38,162** awards based on the 5-year average growth rate for most institutions, with adjustments made to a few schools to reflect more recent trends. In addition, Johnson University is expected to move from the ABLE to the FRAG program, adding 136 awards in FY 2016-17. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **38,658** awards based on a 1.3% annual growth rate. For all subsequent years, the Conference also assumed a 1.3% annual growth rate.

Access to Better Learning and Education Grants (ABLE): For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted **3,129** awards based on a 2-year average growth rate for each institution. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **3,178** awards based on Florida population growth. For all subsequent years, the Conference also assumed annual growth rates equal to Florida population growth.

Florida Student Assistance Grants (FSAG): For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted 133,854 awards based on the actual appropriation divided by the 3-year average award amount. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted 134,925 awards based on a 0.8% growth rate. For all subsequent years, the Conference also assumed a 0.8% annual growth rate.

<u>Children/Spouses of Deceased/Disabled Veterans (CSDDV)</u>: For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted **1,238** awards based on an 83% initial disbursement rate and a 74% renewal rate. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **1,427** awards using the same assumptions. For all subsequent years, the Conference assumed continued growth in the number of initially eligible students and a 74% renewal rate.

<u>Benacquisto Scholarship Program</u>: For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted **735** awards based on a 72% initial disbursement rate and a 92% renewal rate. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **1,022** awards using a 78% initial disbursement rate and a 92% renewal rate. For all subsequent years, the Conference also assumed a 78% initial disbursement rate and a 92% renewal rate.

The adopted estimates are shown on the *Consensus Summary* and in the tables on the following page. More details for each program can be found in the *Consensus Detail*. Across all programs, the Conference anticipates **278,338** awards in FY 2016-17 and **277,315** awards in FY 2017-18.

## Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program (Attachment A-1)

### 2015-16

The July 2016 projection for the 2015-16 cost is approximately \$226.8 million which is about \$13 million less than the appropriation of \$239.8 million, with a student count of 111,725.

#### 2016-17

The July 2016 projection for the 2016-17 cost is \$210.7 million, with a student count of 101,999. The estimate includes 653 additional students who would qualify based on achieving at least an 1170 on the new SAT.

An additional \$1.71 million is needed at the beginning of Term 2 for course hours that students will thereafter drop or withdraw, for which institutions are not required to refund until after the end of the term.

## **Assumptions for the projections:**

Beginning with the 2013-14 high school graduating class, students are required to earn a 1290 SAT to qualify for an initial Florida Academic Scholars (FAS) award, and earn an 1170 SAT to qualify for an initial Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS) award.

- The 2015-16 percentage of high school graduates disbursed an initial award was used to calculate the number of initial students for 2016-17.
- The proportion of initial students disbursed across program and institution type was based on actual 2015-16 numbers as of 6/27/2016.
- The renewal disbursed student counts across sector and program are based on historical renewal rates that also take into account the new initial count of students.
- For both initial and renewal recipients, the average credit hours disbursed, across sector and program, are based on actual 2015-16 numbers as of 6/27/2016.
- Cost projections are based on the actual 2015-16 flat award amount per credit hour.

## William L. Boyd, IV, Florida Resident Access Grant

### 2015-16

- The 2015-16 appropriation was \$115.3 million for 38,423 students.
- The July 2016 projection for full-time equivalent (FTE) students shows an increase of 244 FTE students from 2014-15 for a total of 37,331 FTE students.

### 2016-17

- The 2016-17 appropriation is \$115.3 million for 38,420 FTE students.
- Based on a 1.41% increase over the 2015-16 FTE students, the July 2016 projection for 2016-17 FTE student count is 37,857, projected for consensus. The percent increase is based on the three year average plus the additional 125 FTE students for Johnson University.

## Access to Better Learning and Education

### 2015-16

- The 2015-16 appropriation was \$5.7 million for 3,782 FTE students to each receive a maximum award of \$1,500.
- The July 2016 projection of FTE students shows a decrease of 104 FTE students from 2014-15 for a total of 3,245 FTE students.

### 2016-17

- The 2016-17 appropriation is \$5.1 million for 3,371 FTE students.
- Based on the move of Johnson University from ABLE to FRAG, the July 2016 projection for 2016-17 FTE student count is 3,246, projected for consensus.

### 2015-16

- The 2015-16 appropriation was \$148.7 million.
- Approximately \$642,000 was shifted to programs within the line item, leaving a balance of \$148.1 million, a \$1.3 million increase over the 2014-15 expenditures.
- The balance was redistributed among the four sectors to closely match the 2014-15 proportions.
- The July 2016 projection is 133,585 students.

#### 2016-17

• The appropriation for 2016-17 is \$148.4 million. The total appropriation was redistributed among the four sectors to closely match the 2014-15 proportions.

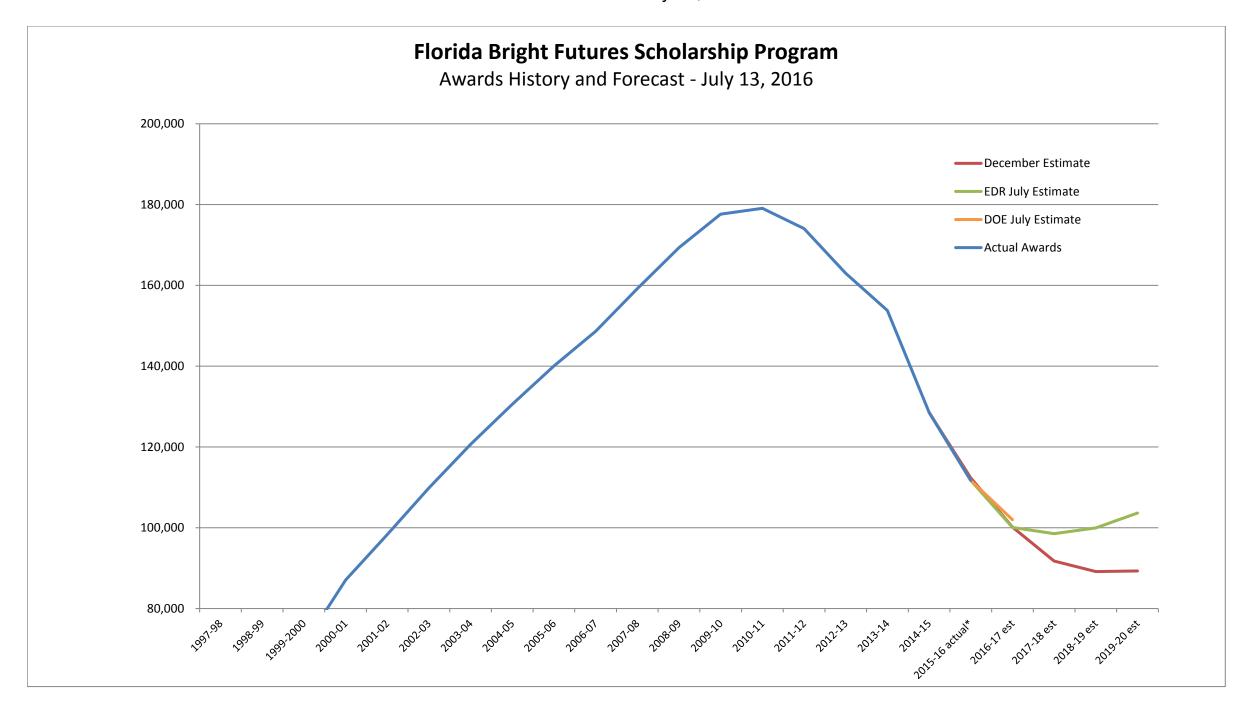
