Education Estimating Conference on Student Financial Aid EXECUTIVE SUMMARY November 16, 2016

The Student Financial Aid Estimating Conference met on November 16, 2016, to adopt estimates for FY 2016-17 through FY 2021-22 for student financial assistance programs.

<u>Bright Futures Scholarships</u>: For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted **95,718** total awards, including 25,388 initial awards and 70,330 renewals. This represents a decrease of 5,502 awards (5.4%) from the previous estimate. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **94,105** total awards, including 32,115 initial awards and 61,990 renewal awards. The initial awards estimates include additional eligible students resulting from the change in SAT scoring (beginning with 2016-17 initials) as well as the introduction of the Gold Seal CAPE Scholars program (beginning with 2017-18 initials). The projected awards dropped significantly from the previous estimates primarily because of fewer renewal awards. Because of changes to eligibility and renewal criteria that have occurred in recent years, there is a great degree of uncertainty in the long range forecast, particularly for renewal awards. As a result, the Conference chose to average the two forecasts that were presented for initial and renewal awards beginning in FY 2018-19.

Florida Resident Access Grants (FRAG): For FY 2016-17 the Conference adopted **38,113** awards based on fall term disbursements, a slight decrease of 49 awards (0.1%) from the previous forecast. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **38,619** awards based on the 3-year average growth rate for each institution. The same methodology was also used for the FY 2018-19 estimate, resulting in a 1.6% growth rate for total awards. For FYs 2019-20 and thereafter, the Conference averaged the two estimates that were presented, resulting in growth rates of 1.2%, 1.7%, and 1.9%.

Access to Better Learning and Education Grants (ABLE): For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted **3,156** awards based on fall term disbursements, which is a slight increase of 27 awards (0.9%) over the previous forecast. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **3,194** awards based on the 2016-17 growth rate (excluding Johnson University which moved to the FRAG program) of 1.2%. For all subsequent years, the Conference also assumed an annual growth rate of 1.2%.

<u>Florida Student Assistance Grants (FSAG)</u>: For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted **133,335** awards based on fall term disbursements, which is 519 awards (0.4%) below the previous forecast. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **135,714** awards based on growth in the total appropriation equal to Florida population growth. For all subsequent years, the Conference also used growth rates equal to Florida population growth.

<u>Children/Spouses of Deceased/Disabled Veterans (CSDDV)</u>: For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted **1,283** awards based on fall term disbursements, which result in an 80.5% initial disbursement rate and a 75.4% renewal rate. This an increase of 45 awards (3.6%) over the previous estimate. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **1,474** awards using a similar initial disbursement rate and a 71.1% renewal rate. For all subsequent years, the Conference assumed continued growth in the number of initially eligible students and a 71.1% renewal rate.

Benacquisto Scholarship Program: For FY 2016-17, the Conference adopted 662 awards based on fall term disbursements. For initial students, this is a decrease of 71 awards from the previous estimate. The renewal awards dropped slightly (decrease of two awards) resulting in a lower renewal rate (91.6% rather than the previous rate of 92%). For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted 873 awards using a 60% initial disbursement rate and a 91.6% renewal rate. For subsequent years, the Conference assumed continued growth in the number of initially eligible students and a 91.6% renewal rate.

The adopted estimates are shown on the *Consensus Summary* and in the tables on the following page. More details for each program can be found in the *Consensus Detail*. Across all programs, the Conference anticipates **272,267** awards in FY 2016-17 and **273,979** awards in FY 2017-18.
