SECTION 1: NARRATIVE

a. Current Law:

Currently, there is no \$1,000 corporate income tax or sales tax voucher for employing former offenders.

b. Proposed Change:

Provides a \$1,000 voucher for use against any tax liability created under chapter 212 or chapter 220, F.S. The voucher is for businesses defined in s. 212.02, F.S., that employ a former offender after July 1, 2003. The business must document:

- 1. that the position was continuously filled for at least 12 full months;
- 2. that the salary for such position is at least \$9 per hour; and
- 3. that the offender performs duties in connection with the operations of the business on a regular full time basis for an average of at least 36 hour per week per month throughout the year.
