#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

#### Criminal Justice Estimating Conference, February 16, 2007

The Criminal Justice Estimating Conference convened February 16, 2006 to revise the forecast of prison admissions and populations. During the four months since the October conference, admissions totaled 12,618, or 893 above the estimate. October admissions were especially strong, totaling 555 more than projected. The population at the end of January 2007 was 90,412, or 690 above the estimate. A review of the latest criminal justice system measures indicated that felony guilty dispositions increased by 7.0 percent in 2006 over 2005. New commitments increased by 7.4 percent in 2006 over the prior year. During the first seven months of FY 06-07, new commitments have been 7.5 percent higher than during the same period in FY 05-06. Sentences of a year and a day, the minimum sentence served in the state prison system instead of a county jail, increased by 32.6 percent in 2006 over 2005. Offenders with these very short sentences accounted for nearly 60 percent of the increase in new commitments in 2006.

The conferees adopted a forecast which assumes a 7.25 percent increase in new commitments in FY 06-07, declining to 1.0 percent in FY 11-12.

The new forecast is 1,064 higher than the October forecast at the end of FY 06-07 and 2,783 higher at the end of FY 11-12.



# **CRIMINAL JUSTICE TRENDS**

#### > Accuracy of October 2006 forecast

- The end-of-month population on January 31st was 90,412. This was 690 over the projected 89,722 (.8% error). (Page 1)
- Total admissions since the October conference totaled 12,618. This was 893 more than projected for an error of 7.6%. October and November were particularly strong months with 555 more admissions than projected in October and 288 more than projected in November. (Page 1)
- Looking at the two components of admissions—new commitments and conditional/control release technical violators, errors were greater for new commitments than for all admissions (11,047 projected; 11,979 actual; 8.4% error.) CJEC had projected in October that FY 06-07 new commitment growth over FY 05-06 would be 3.2% but for the first seven months of the fiscal year new commitments have grown by 7.5%. On the other hand, there were slightly fewer conditional release offenders returned to prison with technical violations than projected (678 projected; 639 actual). (Page 2)

#### > Crime

- **Reported crime** has continued to decline since 2001 when 911,292 index offenses were reported. In 2005, there were 838,063 reported index offenses, down 1.5 percent from 2004. (down 8.7% since 2001). (Page 3)
- The number of **reported violent offenses** increased by 1.7 percent in 2005, the first increase since 2001. Violent offenses, which include murder, forcible sexual offenses, robbery, and aggravated assault, were 15% of all index offenses (non-violent index offenses include burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft.) Note that drug related offenses are not included in index offenses. (Page 4)
- Data for the first six months of 2006 indicate that the above crime trends are continuing. While the number of total index crimes declined by .3 percent in the first six months of 2006 compared to 2005, the number of violent crimes increased by 3.2 percent. (Page 5)
- The **crime rate** (reported index crimes per 100,000 population) continues to decline and in 2005 was 4,677, down from 4,855 in 2004 (a 3.7% decrease). While not as large as the 6 percent decrease from 2004 to 2005, this decrease continues a downward trend that began in 1989. The 2005 rate is less than 53% of the1989 rate. (Page 6)
- While reported index crimes and the crime rate continue to decline, arrests have been increasing and in 2005 there were 1,056,121 total arrests, up 2.6 percent over 2004. However, this overall increase was not due to increases in arrests for index crimes. These arrests declined by 2.1 percent from 2004. Instead, the increase was due to increases in non-index crime arrests. Drug arrests increased from 150,334 to 160,649—an increase of 6.9 percent and miscellaneous offense arrests increased from 460,902 to 481,187—up 4.4%. (Pages 7 and 8)

#### Filings and Guilty Dispositions

- After four years of declines in the number of **felony filings** (1999-2002) and one year with a small increase of 1.4 percent, the number of filings increased in the last three years, by 3.9 percent in 2004 and by 9.9 percent in 2005, and by 5.0 percent in 2006. (Page 9)
- During the same period, the number of **guilty dispositions** declined in one year (2000), remained flat in another (2002), and has shown increases of nearly 2 to 3 percent in four of the other years. However, the number of guilty dispositions increased by 6.1 percent in 2005 and by 7.0 percent in 2006. Increases of this magnitude haven't been seen since 1997. Also, the monthly pattern suggests that some December guilty dispositions may not have been captured in the current SRS data run so the annual increase may exceed 7.0 percent when all data have been received. (Page 10)
- The increased in guilty dispositions in the last two years is due almost entirely to increases in nonviolent and drug offenses. Violent offense guilty dispositions decreased between 2004 and 2005 and increased by 2.2 percent in 2006 while nonviolent guilty dispositions increased by 8.1% in 2006 and drug guilty dispositions increased by 7.9 percent. (Page 11)
- The percent of **guilty dispositions which are imprisoned** as new commitments has trended upward from 16.5 percent in 1999 to nearly 21percent in the last three years. With guilty dispositions at nearly 171,000 per year, a 1 percent increase in incarceration would result in over 1,700 additional new commitments to prison. (Page 12)

#### Prison Admissions

- There were 36,722 **admissions to prison** in FY 05-06, up 7.6 percent from FY 04-05. This growth follows a year in which admissions to prison increased by just 1.5 percent and is close to the 9.9 and 11.0 percent increases observed in FY 02-03 and FY 03-04, respectively. (Page 18)
- **New commitments**, which make up about 94 percent of total admissions, totaled 34,546 in FY 05-06. This represented an 8.1 percent increase over the prior year. New commitments increased by 1.0 percent in FY 04-05 and by 10.8 and 10.4 percent in FY 02-03 and FY 03-04, respectively. (Page 19)
- A much smoother growth pattern is seen in calendar year **new commitments.** After the very large increase of 11.6% in 2003, new commitments increased by 3.6 percent in 2004, by 5.7 percent in 2005, and by 7.4 percent in 2006. (Page 20)
- Offenders sentenced to prison for **technical violations** increased by 20 percent in FY 03-04 (the first year after the "zero tolerance" policy was implemented by the Department of Corrections) and have remained at this higher level although growth has slowed. This group grew by 7.1 percent in FY 04-05 and by a more modest 3.9 percent in FY 05-06. (Pages 21 and 22)
- In the eight month period from July 2002 through February 2003 (before "zero tolerance"), there were 633 **technical violators admitted to prison per month** (on average). Since March 2003, this has increased to 836 resulting in an additional 203 technical violator admissions per month. Since the beginning of "zero tolerance" there has been 9,135 additional technical violators admitted to prison over what would have been expected based on pre-zero tolerance levels. (Page 22)
- The number of technical violators has increased every six-month period except one since the implementation of the "zero tolerance" policy, rising from 784 (July through December 2003) to 929 (January through June 2006). (Page 22)

- The **sentence length distribution** of new commitments continues to be weighted toward shorter sentences. There were nearly 2,500 additional new commitments in 2006 over the prior year, and nearly 60 percent of the additional new commitments (59.7%) had sentences of a year-and-a-day. Almost 83 percent of the additional new commitments had sentences of 21 months or less. For comparison purposes, sentences of 21 months or less accounted for just 36 percent of the increase in new commitments between 2001and 2002. (Page 23)
- The average **sentence length** of new commitments continues the downward trend observed in recent years. In 2006, the average sentence length of new commitments was 53.3 months (4.4 years), down from a 2005 average of 55.2 months. Average sentence length has declined by almost 9 months since 2001. (Page 24)
- In January 2007, the average **sentence length** of new commitments fell below 50 months for the first time (49.6 months, 4.1 years). (Page 25)
- The percentage of year-and-a-day sentences has continued to increase and in 2006, 16.8 percent of new commitment sentences were a year-and-a-day in length, up from 8.8 percent in 2002. (Page 26)
- Year-and-a-day sentences increased by 33.2 percent in 2006 over the previous year. Nearly 23 percent of the increase in year-and-a-day sentences was from Hillsborough County and 16.5 percent of the increase was from Polk County. (Pages 27)
- **Growth in new commitments** is not uniform across the state. Between 2005 and 2006, 39 counties experienced positive growth in the number of new commitments and 28 counties showed no growth (or negative growth).
- Several counties have played major roles in the increases in new commitments observed over the last few years. Hillsborough continues to lead the state in the **number of new commitments** with over 3,700 new commitments in 2006, nearly 11 percent of the state total. In second place, Broward County's new commitments accounted for 8.6 percent of the total. Polk County accounted for 7.2%. (Page 28)
- Hillsborough and Broward also lead the state in the growth of new commitments. Hillsborough sent 734 more new commitments to state prison in 2006, up 24.7 percent over 2005. Hillsborough County's increase in new commitments accounted for 30.3 percent of the total change in new commitments. Broward County sent over 3,000 new commitments in 2006, up 16 percent and accounting for 17 percent of the growth. (Page 28)
- Florida's three **largest counties**, Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach, account for nearly 30 percent of the state population but in 2006, these counties accounted for 17.6 percent of the state's new commitments to prison and 14.7 percent of the year-and-a-day sentences. On the other hand, Polk County accounted for 3.1 percent of the state's total population but for 7.2 percent of the state's new commitments and 16.5 percent of the year-and-a-day sentences. Hillsborough County, with 6.3 percent of the state population accounted for 10.6 percent of new commitments and 22.8 percent of year-and-a-day sentences. (Pages 29 and 30)
- The 7.4 percent increase in new commitments in 2006 was not evenly distributed by **offense group**. The largest increase in terms of raw numbers was in the "Drug" category, increasing by over a thousand (11.5%) between 2005 and 2006 and accounting for nearly 43 percent of the increase in new commitments. Weapons offenses increased by the largest percentage (19.7%) but this is a very small group. The "Other" category grew by nearly 650 and accounted for over 25 percent of the total increase. "Property Theft/Fraud/Damage" also showed strong growth. New commitments declined slightly in 2006 in the "Sexual/Lewd Behavior" and "Robbery" categories. (Page 31)

- The "Drug", "Other", and "Property Theft/Fraud/Damage" categories also showed strong growth in Hillsborough and Polk Counties. For Broward County, the "Drugs" category howed the largest growth. (Pages 32-34)
- 2006 increases in the "Drug" offense category were dominated by cocaine possession, which accounted for over 50 percent of the increase. Increases in cocaine S/M/D and selling cocaine within restricted distances of schools or other locations each accounted for about 12 percent of the increase. While the number of individuals incarcerated for methamphetamine offenses is still relatively small, they continue to increase. Methamphetamine offenses accounted for 8.1 percent of the increase in "Drug" offenses in 2006. (Page 35)
- **Cocaine possession** accounted for more than half of the increase in the "**Drug**" category in both Broward and Polk Counties. (Page 36)
- "Driving with a suspended license" accounted for nearly 40 percent of the increase in the "Other" category statewide. Over 1,400 offenders were sentenced to prison in 2006 with this primary offense. Sex registration offenses accounted for over 25 percent of the increase. (Page 37)
- "Driving with a suspended license" accounted for large shares of the increase in the "Other" category in Broward, Hillsborough, and Polk Counties. In Hillsborough County, this offense accounted for nearly 60 percent of the increase in the "Other" category. Felony DUI also played a large role in the increase in Broward and Hillsborough Counties. (Pages 37 and 38)
- New commitments with year-and-a-day sentences have a wide variety of offenses but cocaine possession and "driving with a suspended license" are the most common primary offenses. These two offenses accounted for over 25 percent of the total year-and-a-day new commitments in 2006. (Page 39)
- The percentage of new commitments sentenced for third degree felonies has been increasing each year. In 2006, 47.4 percent of new commitments were sentenced for third degree felonies, up from 37.1 percent in 2000. (Page 40)

### > OTHER TRENDS

- The percentage of offenders in county jail who have been sentenced for a felony has declined in the last year and a half. In 2006, about 18.1 percent of offenders in county jail had been sentenced for a felony compared to around 20 percent in earlier years. (Page 41)
- County jail populations have also been affected by zero tolerance. The June 30, 2006 ADP of 63,481 was 22 percent higher than the June 30, 2002 ADP of 51,969. (Page 42)
- The number of **prison inmates per 100,000 population** continues to increase. In the last 25 years, this rate has grown from 200.4 (in FY 79-80) to 480.8 (in FY 05-06). This rate has remained relatively flat since FY 94-95 but began to rise in FY 02-03. (Pages 43)




