

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Criminal Justice Estimating Conference, September 15, 2011

The Criminal Justice Estimating Conference convened September 15, 2011 to revise the forecast of prison admissions and populations. During the seven months monitored since the February conference, admissions totaled 20,566, or 295 below the estimate. The population at the end of August 2011 was 101,779, or 473 below the estimate.

A review of the latest criminal justice system measures indicated that reported index crimes decreased by 6.6 percent in 2010. Felony filings declined by 3.3 percent and guilty dispositions decreased by 8.4 percent in 2010 over 2009. New commitments decreased by 5.7 percent in FY 2010-11 over the prior fiscal year.

There were 368 fewer technical violators admitted to prison in FY 2010-11 than in the previous fiscal year. Year-and-a-day sentences declined in FY 2010-11 by 723 from the FY 2009-10 level and the average sentence length for new commitments increased from 59.1 months in FY 2009-10 to 60.2 months in FY 2010-11.

The conferees adopted a forecast which assumes a 7.6 percent decrease in total admissions in FY 11-12 and a 0.9 percent decrease in FY 12-13. Total admissions then increase by 0.6 percent in FY 13-14 and by 0.2 in the last three years of the forecast period.

The June 30 projected prison population is expected to decline in the first three years of the forecast period, remain virtually flat for two years, and increase by 0.3 percent in FY 16-17. The new forecast is 616 lower than the February forecast at the end of FY 11-12 and 3,860 lower at the end of FY 15-16.

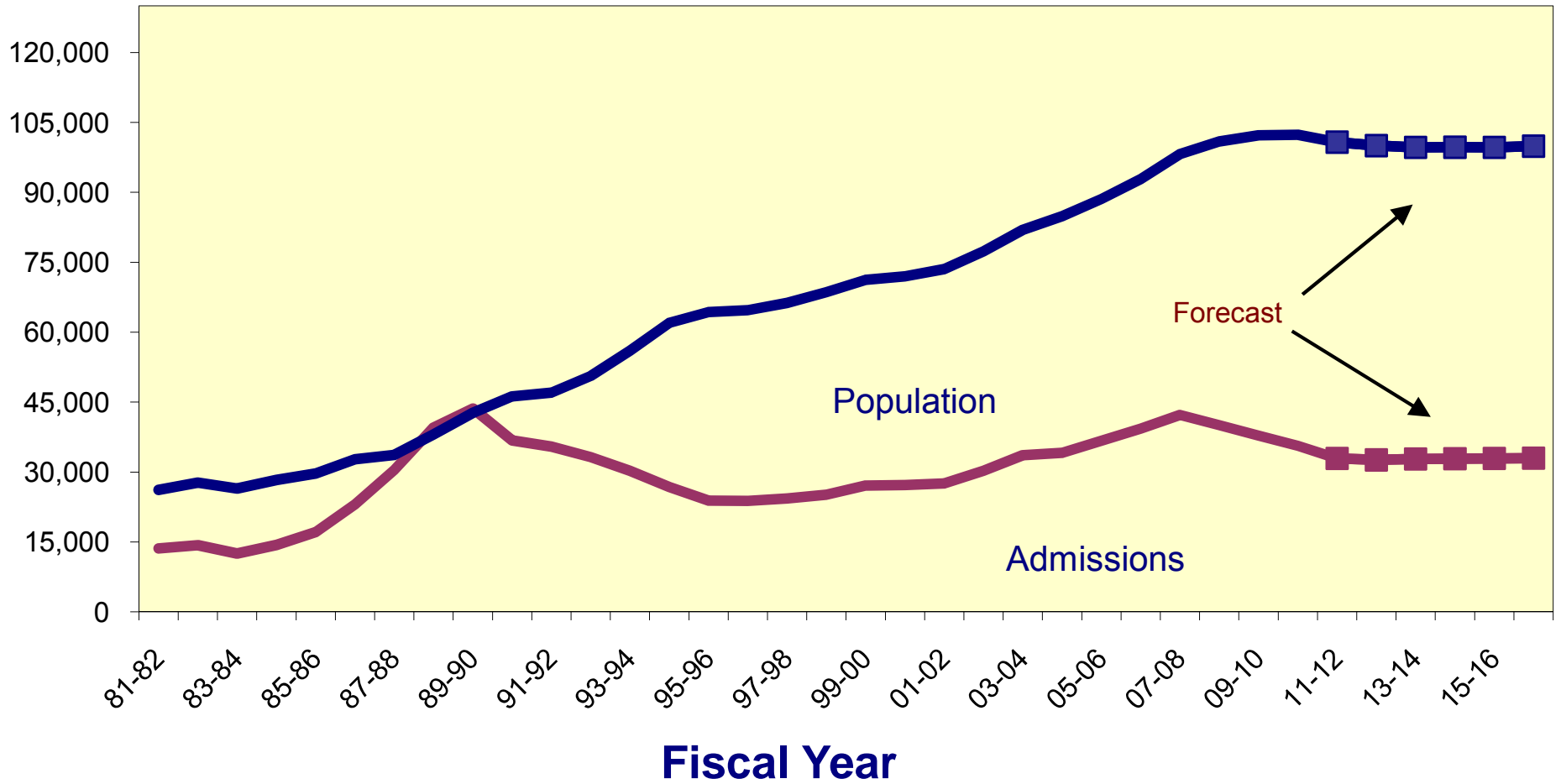

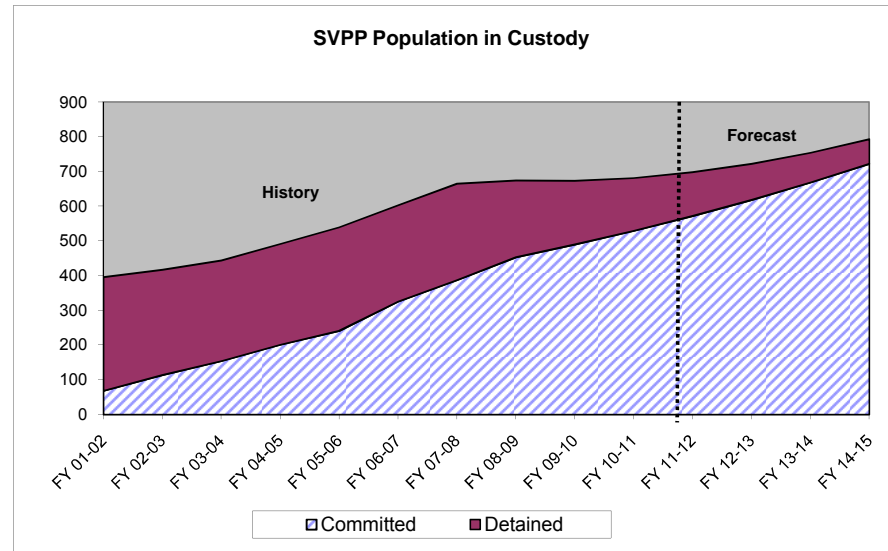
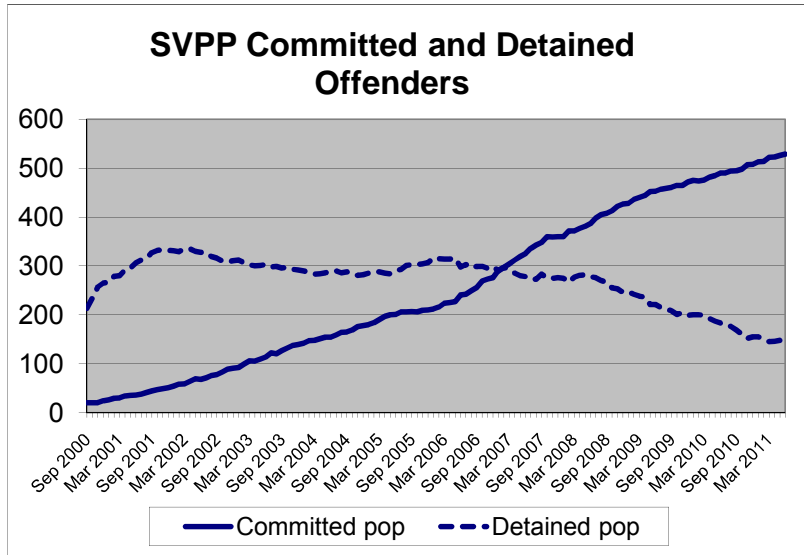

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CRIMINAL JUSTICE TRENDS

➤ Accuracy of February 2011 forecast

- **Admissions** since the February conference totaled 20,566—295 fewer than projected for an error of -1.4%. (Page 1)
- The **end-of-month population** on August 31st was 101,779. This was 473 under the projected 102,252 (-.5% error). (Page 1)
- Over 96 percent of total admissions are new commitments and the percentage error was lower for this group than for total admissions. There were 19,895 new commitments, 155 fewer than projected (-.8% error). The projected number of conditional and control release violators returned to prison with technical violations was 140 fewer than projected (-17.3% error). (Page 2)

➤ Crime

- The number of index offenses decreased in 2010 by 54,041 (-6.6%) from the 2009 level of 824,559. The 770,518 index crimes reported in 2010 was lower than reported in any year since 1984. This is the second year in a row in which index offenses declined after three years of increases. (Page 3)
- The number of **reported violent offenses** decreased by 10.1 percent in 2010. Violent offenses, which include murder, forcible sexual offenses, robbery, and aggravated assault, were 13.2 percent of all index offenses in 2010, down from 13.8 percent in 2009. Non-violent index offenses include burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft. These decreased by 6.0 percent in 2010. Note that drug related offenses are not included in index offenses. (Page 4)
- The crime rate fell from 4,397.5 in 2009 to 4,104.7 in 2010 (-6.7%). This was the second year in which the crime rate declined after two years of modest increases. (Page 6)
- 2010 **arrests** declined by 2.8 percent from 1,049,929 in 2009 to 1,020,497 in 2010. Arrests for index offenses declined by 9.6 percent in 2010 while arrests for non-index crimes declined by 1.3 percent. The largest percentage decreases in index offense arrests were in motor vehicle theft (down 18.3%) and robbery (down 14.1%). (Pages 7 - 8)

➤ Filings and Guilty Dispositions

- After five years of increases in the number of **felony filings** (2003-2007), the number of filings declined by 2.8 percent in 2008, by 8.9 percent in 2009, and by 3.3 percent in 2010. (Page 9)
- **Violent** offense filings declined by 2.4 percent in 2010 and filings for **nonviolent** offenses declined by 3.1 percent. During the same period, **drug** filings declined by 4.0 percent. (Pages 10 and 11)
- The share of **violent** filings increased from 19.6 percent in 2009 to 19.8 percent in 2010, the share of filings that are **nonviolent** remained the same at 49.9 percent, and the share of **drug** filings decreased from 30.5 percent to 30.3 percent. (Pages 10 and 11)

- After three years of large increases, the number of **guilty dispositions** increased by just 1.1 percent in 2008, decreased by 14.1 percent in 2009, and decreased by 8.4 percent in 2010. (Page 12)
- **Violent** offense guilty dispositions decreased by 8.2 percent in 2010 over 2009 and guilty dispositions for **nonviolent** offenses decreased by 7.8 percent. During the same period, drug guilty dispositions declined by 9.5 percent. (Pages 13 and 14)
- The share of guilty dispositions for **violent** offenses remained the same in 2010 as in 2009 (17.5%) while the shares for **nonviolent** offenses increased and for **drug** offenses declined. (Pages 13 and 14)
- The most current data available indicate that the decline in **filings** has ended but **guilty dispositions** are continuing to decline. Filings for January through June 2011 obtained from August 2011 data were .7 percent above the January through June 2010 filings obtained in October 2010. January through June 2011 guilty dispositions were down 3.1 percent from the same period in 2010. (Page 15)
- The percent of **guilty dispositions which are imprisoned** as new commitments has trended upward from less than 16 percent in the late nineties to 24.0 percent in 2010. With annual guilty dispositions over 145,000, a 1 percent increase in incarceration could result in over 1,450 additional new commitments to prison. (Page 16)

➤ Prison Admissions

- There were 35,616 **admissions to prison** in FY 10-11, down 5.8 percent from FY 09-10. This was the third fiscal year in a row that prison admissions declined by more than five percent. Growth in each of the three prior fiscal years equaled or exceeded 7.0 percent. (Page 23)
- **New commitments**, which make up over 96 percent of all admissions, totaled 34,382 in FY 10-11. This represented a 5.7 percent decrease from the prior year. New commitments had declined by 5.9 percent in FY 09-10 and by 4.3 percent in FY 08-09. Growth in each of the three prior fiscal years equaled or exceeded 8.0 percent. (Page 24)
- A different growth pattern is seen in calendar year new commitments. New commitments declined by 6.9 percent in 2009 and by 6.1 percent in 2010. In 2007, new commitments grew by 10.2 percent and in 2008 they grew by 2.3 percent. (Page 25)
- **Conditional and control release violators without new sentences** comprise the remaining 3.5 percent of total admissions. These admissions declined in FY 10-11 by 8.2 percent. This followed a 2.2 percent increase in FY 09-10. (Page 26)
- **New commitments** moved to a new level in March 2003 at the beginning of **zero tolerance** and have remained at or above that level ever since. However, it is clear that new commitments have been trending down since late 2008. (Page 27)
- Offenders sentenced to prison for **technical violations** in FY 10-11 decreased by 4.9 percent from the prior fiscal year bringing the number well below pre-zero tolerance levels. In FY 10-11, 595 technical violators were sentenced to prison per month (on average). (Page 28)
- After a three-year period during which **technical violators as a percentage of total admissions** averaged 29.1 percent (and exceeded 30 percent in 11 months), this percentage averaged 24.0 percent in FY 07-08, 20.5 percent in FY 08-09, and 19.9 percent in FY 09-10. This percentage increased very slightly to 20.1 percent in FY 10-11. This is still well below pre-zero tolerance levels. (Page 29)

- After several years of declines, the average **sentence length** of new commitments has increased in each of the last four fiscal years and was 60.2 months (5.0 years) in FY 10-11. This is very close to the pre-zero tolerance average sentence length of 60.0 months observed in FY 02-03. (Pages 30 and 31)
- In August 2011 the average **sentence length** of new commitments was 60.3 months (5.0 years). (Pages 31 and 32)
- While large numbers of new commitments are sentenced to prison with short sentences, the **sentence length distribution** has been changing over the last few years. Total new commitments declined by 2,068 (-5.7%) in FY 10-11 from the prior fiscal year but the largest decline was in year-and-a-day sentences which declined by 723 (-20.1%). Sentences from 367 days through 15 months declined by 465 (-11.8%). There were much smaller declines in most of the other sentence length categories. Sentences of 40-45 and 46-51 months each increased slightly. (Page 33)
- The **number of year-and-a-day sentences** declined over the last four fiscal years, falling by 7.8 percent in FY 07-08, by 21.5 percent in FY 08-09, by 24.6 percent in FY 09-10, and by 20.1 percent in FY 10-11. In FY 10-11, there were 2,878 new commitments sentenced with year-and-a-day sentences. This level was last observed in FY 02-03, prior to zero tolerance. (Page 34)
- The **percentage of year-and-a-day sentences** continued the decline first observed in FY 07-08 after several years of increases. In FY 10-11, 8.4 percent of new commitments had year-and-a-day sentences, down from 9.9 percent in FY 09-10. This is slightly lower than the FY 01-02 level of 8.8 percent and well below the levels observed at mid-decade. (Page 35)
- The largest decline in **year-and-a-day sentences** was in Pinellas County where these sentences declined by 147 (down 72.6%). Other counties experiencing large declines were Hillsborough (-97), Polk (-93), and Miami-Dade (-89). (Page 36)
- There has been an increase in **year-and-a-month** sentences in **Hillsborough County** since November 2007. These increases were in conjunction with a large decline in **year-and-a-day sentences**. While Hillsborough's percentage of total new commitments that are either year-and-a-day or year-and-a-month in length has declined since October 2006 and has been below 20 percent in most months since October of 2009, looking at both of these short sentences suggests that the decline observed in year-and-a-day sentences does not represent as great a change in sentencing behavior as one might initially assume. Recent data suggest that Pinellas County is also using the year-and-month sentence as an alternative to year-and-a-day sentences. (Page 37)
- **Growth in new commitments** is not uniform across the state. Between FY 09-10 and FY 10-11, 29 counties experienced positive growth in the number of new commitments and 38 counties showed negative growth. Between FY 08-09 and FY 09-10, 30 counties experienced positive growth in new commitments.
- Duval County had the largest **number of new commitments** in FY 10-11 (2,533, 7.4 % of total). Hillsborough's new commitments accounted for 7.0 percent of the state total in FY 10-11. New commitments from Pinellas County accounted for 6.4 percent of the total (up from 6.2%). Broward's new commitments accounted for 6.1 percent of the total (down from 7.3 percent in FY 09-10). (Page 38)
- Broward and Hillsborough led the state in the number of **reductions in new commitments** in FY 10-11 with Broward's new commitments declining from 2,668 in FY 09-10 to 2,106 in FY 10-11 (-21.1%). Hillsborough County's new commitments fell from 2,902 to 2,406, a decline of 17.1 percent. (Page 39)

- While a majority of Florida’s counties sent fewer new commitments to prison in FY 10-11 than in FY 09-10, Columbia County sent 87 additional new commitments to prison in FY 10-11 (30.5% growth). New commitments in Flagler, St. Johns, Jackson, Levy, and Indian River also increased by more than 50 in FY 10-11. (Page 39)
- Florida’s three **largest counties**, Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach, accounted for 29.6 percent of the state population in 2010 but these counties accounted for 16.4 percent of the state’s new commitments to prison in FY 10-11 and 20.9 percent of the year-and-a-day sentences. On the other hand, Polk County accounted for 3.2 percent of the state’s total population but for 4.4 percent of new commitments and 10.4 percent of the year-and-a-day sentences. Twenty percent of Polk County’s new commitments came to prison with year-and-a-day sentences. (Pages 40 and 41)
- The 5.7 percent decrease in new commitments in FY 10-11 was not evenly distributed by **offense group**. The largest decrease in terms of raw numbers was in the “Drugs” category, decreasing by 657 (-6.7%) between FY 09-10 and FY 10-11. “Property Theft/Fraud/Damage” offenses decreased by 389 (-7.1%). Other large decreases occurred in the “Other “ category down by 372 (-11.5%) and the “Robbery” category down by 324 (-11.0%). (Page 42)
- Declines in “**Cocaine sale/manufacture/deliver**” contributed most to the decline in the “**Drugs**” category, decreasing by 549 (-18.9%). “**Cocaine possession**” fell by 252 (-15.3%) and offenses related to selling cocaine within 1,000 feet of a school or other restricted place declined by 19.5 percent. “**Possess controlled substance (other)**” increased by 99 (20.0%). (Page 43)
- “**Grand theft motor vehicle**” contributed most to the decline in the “**Property Theft, Fraud, Damage**” offense category. This offense declined by 183 (-28.5%). “**Grand theft (GE \$300/LT \$5,000)**” fell by 167 (-13.1%). (Page 44)
- In the “**Other**” offense category, “**Fleeing and eluding law enforcement officer**” offenses contributed the most to the decline falling by 225 (-23.7%) “**Driving with a suspended/revoked license**” declined by 158 (-20.6%). (Page 45)
- “**Robbery, no firearm or deadly weapon**” and “**Robbery with other weapon**” each declined by about 95 (-9.2% and -29.6% declines, respectively). “**Robbery with a firearm or deadly weapon**” declined by 87 (-6.6%). (Page 46)
- New commitments with **year-and-a-day sentences** have a wide variety of offenses. In FY 10-11, “**Cocaine possession**” and “**Burglary of an unoccupied structure**” were the most common primary offenses. These two offenses accounted for 16.3 percent of the total year-and-a-day new commitments in FY 09-10 and for 15.5 percent in FY 10-11. (Page 47)
- The **year-and-a-day offense** with the largest decline in the number of new commitments between FY 09-10 and FY 10-11 was “**Cocaine sale/manufacture/deliver**”. There were 104 fewer year-and-a-day offenders with this offense, a decline of 36.2 percent. There was also a large decline in “**Grand theft, \$300 - \$4,999**” new commitments which fell from 280 in FY 09-10 to 182 in FY 10-11 (-35.0%). “**Cocaine possession**” fell by 92 (-28.0 %). (Page 47)
- Declines in the “**Drugs**” and “**Property Theft/Fraud/Damage**” offense categories for **year-and-a-day sentences** accounted for the largest share of the decrease in these sentences between FY 09-10 and FY 10-11, both falling by about 220 (-20.1% and -24.5%, respectively). Large declines were also observed in the “**Violent, Other**” and the “**Other**” categories. (Page 48)

- The **percentage of new commitments sentenced for third degree felonies** decreased in the last fiscal year falling from 45.6 percent in FY 09-10 to 41.7 percent in FY 10-11. (Page 49)
- The number of offenders sentenced to prison under **10-20-Life** declined in FY 10-11 after increasing in each of the last five years. In FY 10-11, 1,385 offenders sentenced under these provisions received mandatory prison terms with 13.2 percent receiving a sentence at least 25 years in length. (Pages 50 and 51)

➤ COUNTY JAILS

- **Average daily population** in county jails increased after the implementation of zero tolerance. The June 30, 2011 average daily population (ADP) of 53,816 was well below the June 30, 2010 ADP of 58,743 but was still higher than the June 30, 2002 ADP of 51,969 prior to zero tolerance. At the peak of zero tolerance, the ADP increased to nearly 66,000 (July 2007). (Page 52)
- The **average daily population** has been below 60,000 since August 2009. (Page 53)
- In the first six months of 2011, 20.0 percent of the **offenders in county jail had been sentenced for a felony**. This is approaching the levels observed prior to 2005. The percentage has fluctuated around a new lower level since early 2005. (Page 54)

➤ OTHER TRENDS

- After increasing from 112,529 in June 2006 to 119,216 in June 2008, the number of offenders on active supervision fell in FY 09-10 by 3.5 percent and in FY 10-11 by 1.2 percent. There were 113,622 offenders on active supervision in June 2011. (Page 55)
- The number of offenders with either a life or a death sentence has increased over the last twenty years from 4,549 in 1990 to 12,080 in 2011. In 1990, 10.6 percent of inmates were serving a life or death sentence on June 30. In 2011, this percentage had increased to 11.8 percent. (Page 56)
- The number of **prison inmates per 100,000 Florida population**, fell in FY 10-11 to 539.9. In the last 30 years, the incarceration rate had grown from 200.4 (in FY 79-80) to 542.9 (in FY 09-10). This rate had remained relatively flat between FY 94-95 and FY 01-02 but had risen each year since FY 02-03. (Pages 57 and 58)

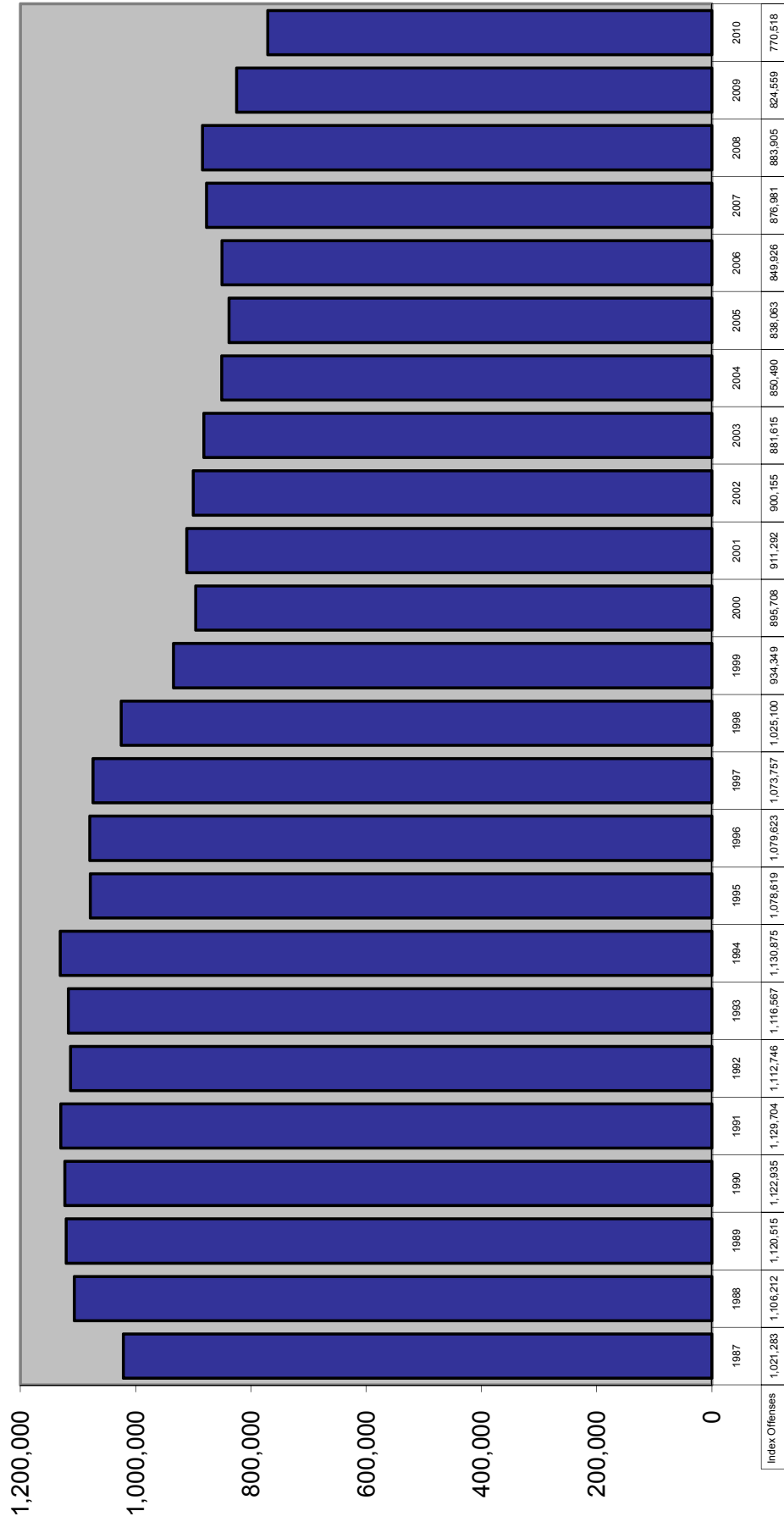

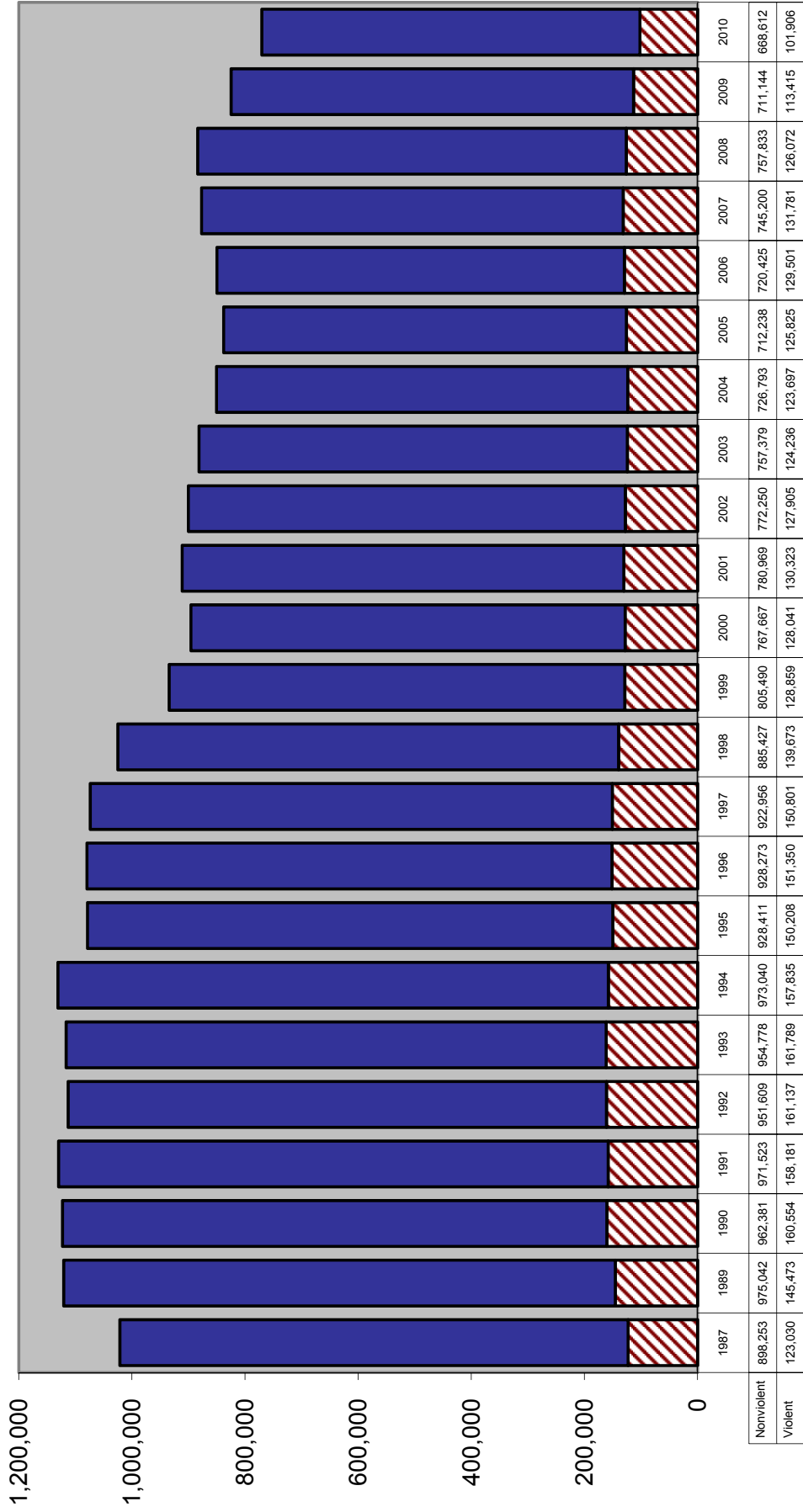

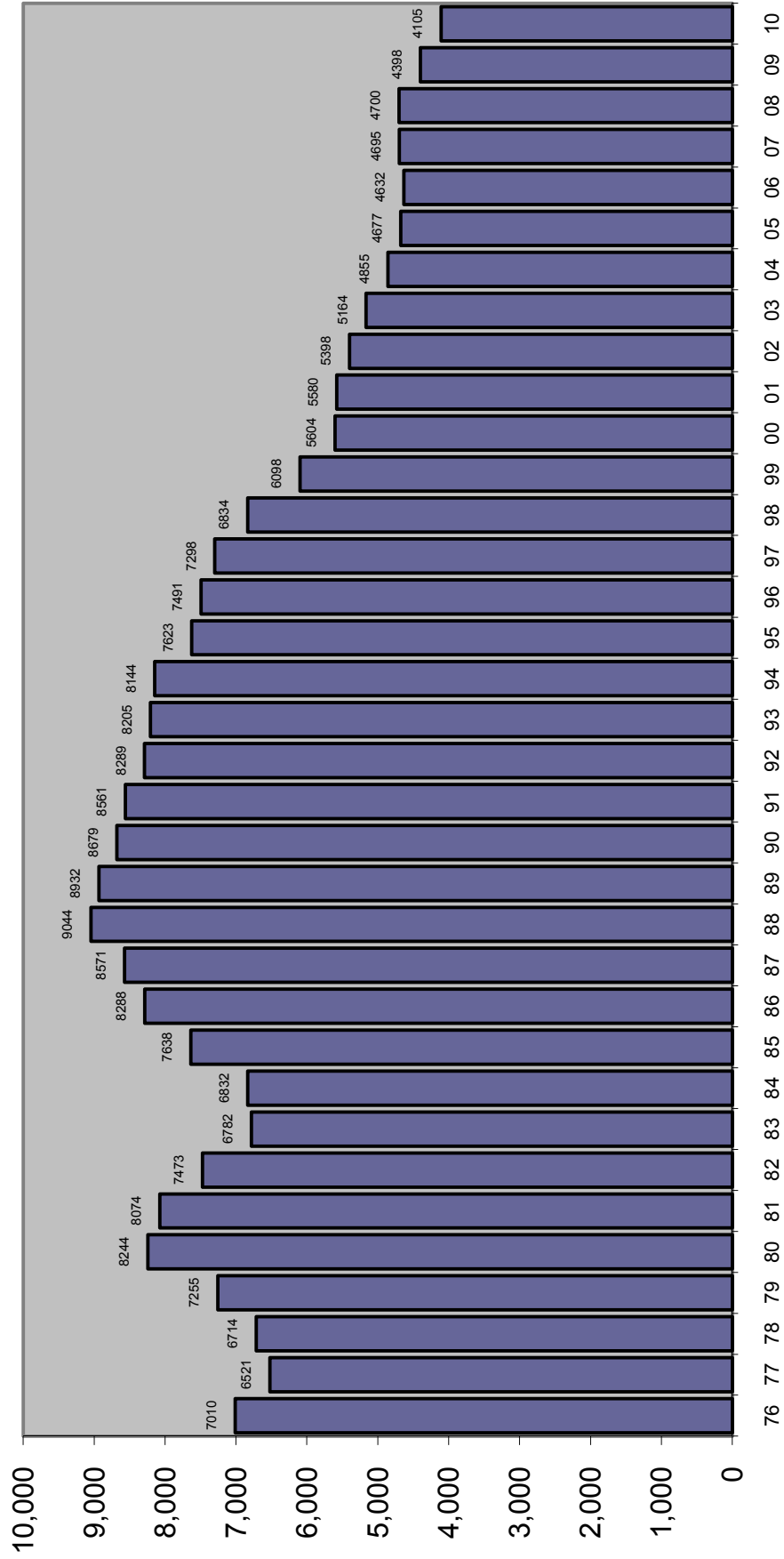

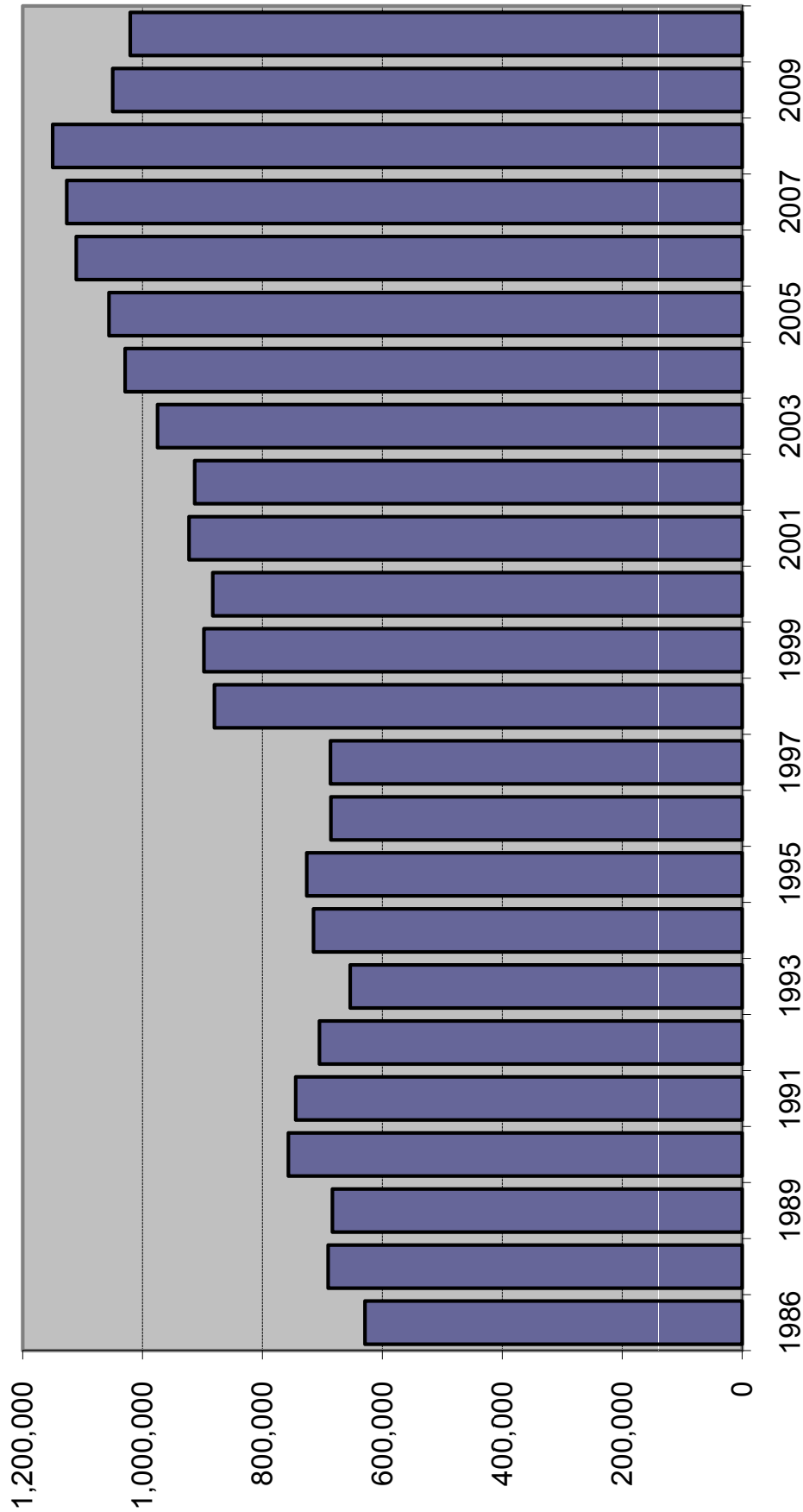

TOTAL ARRESTS



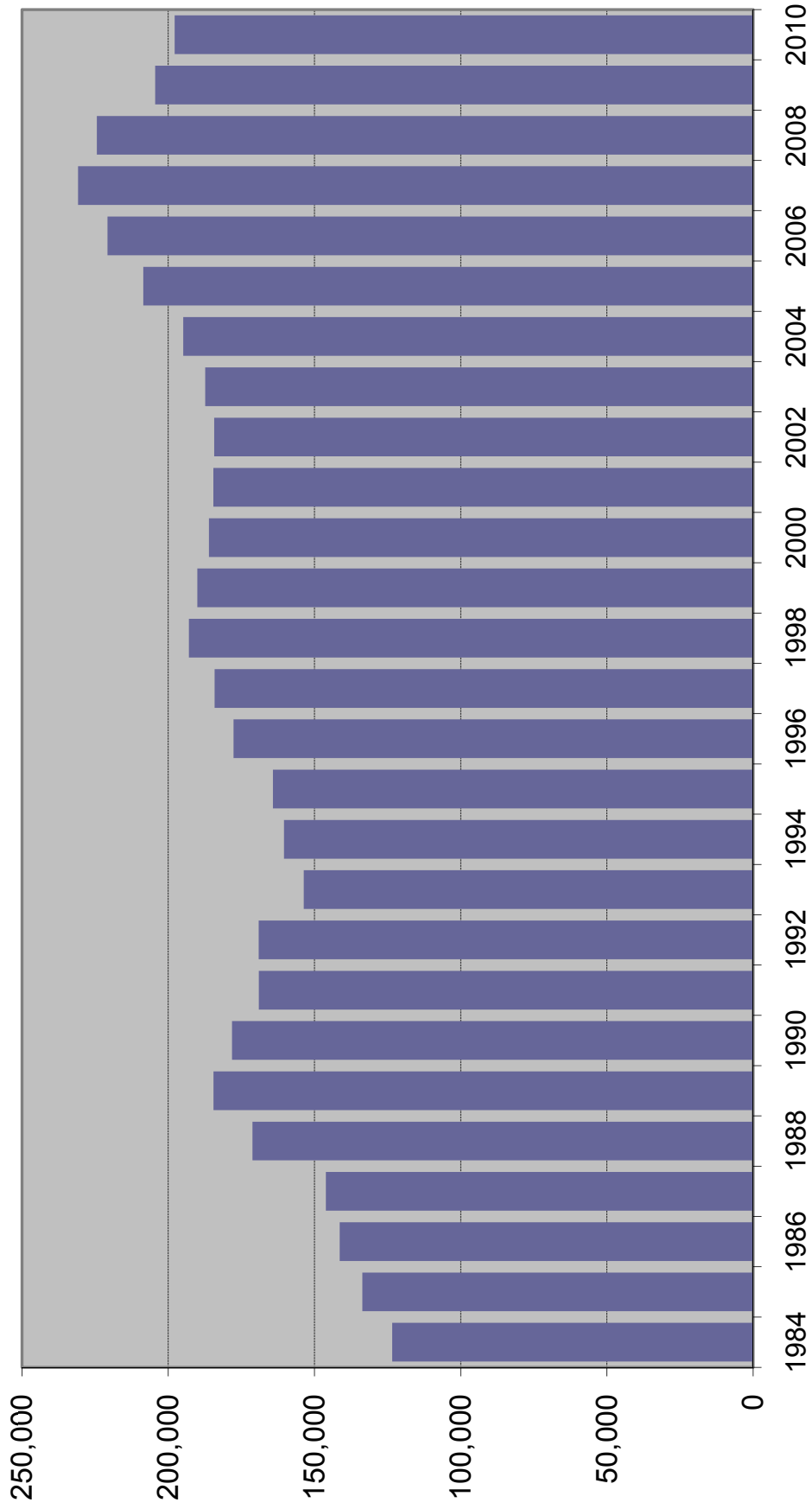

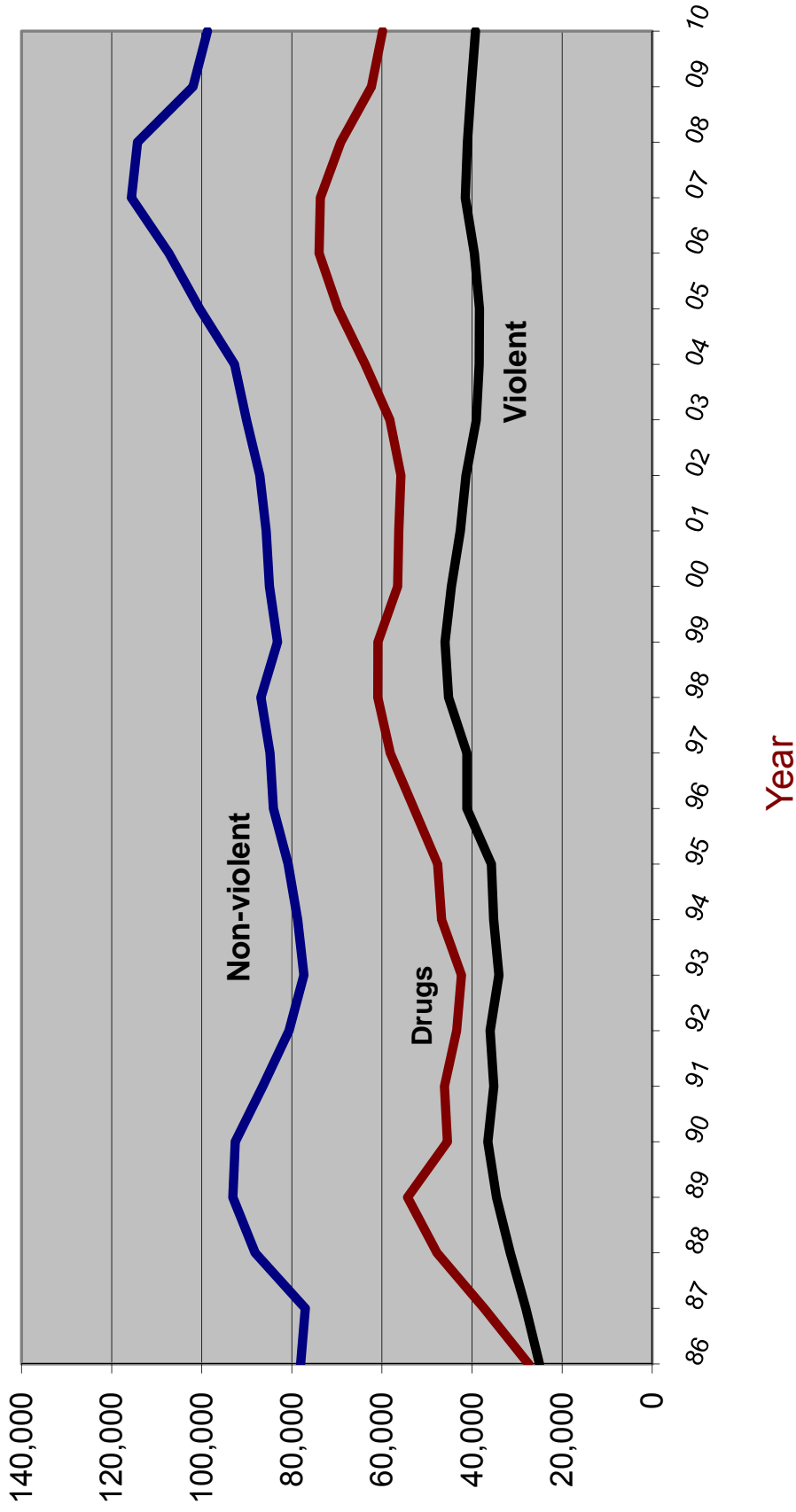

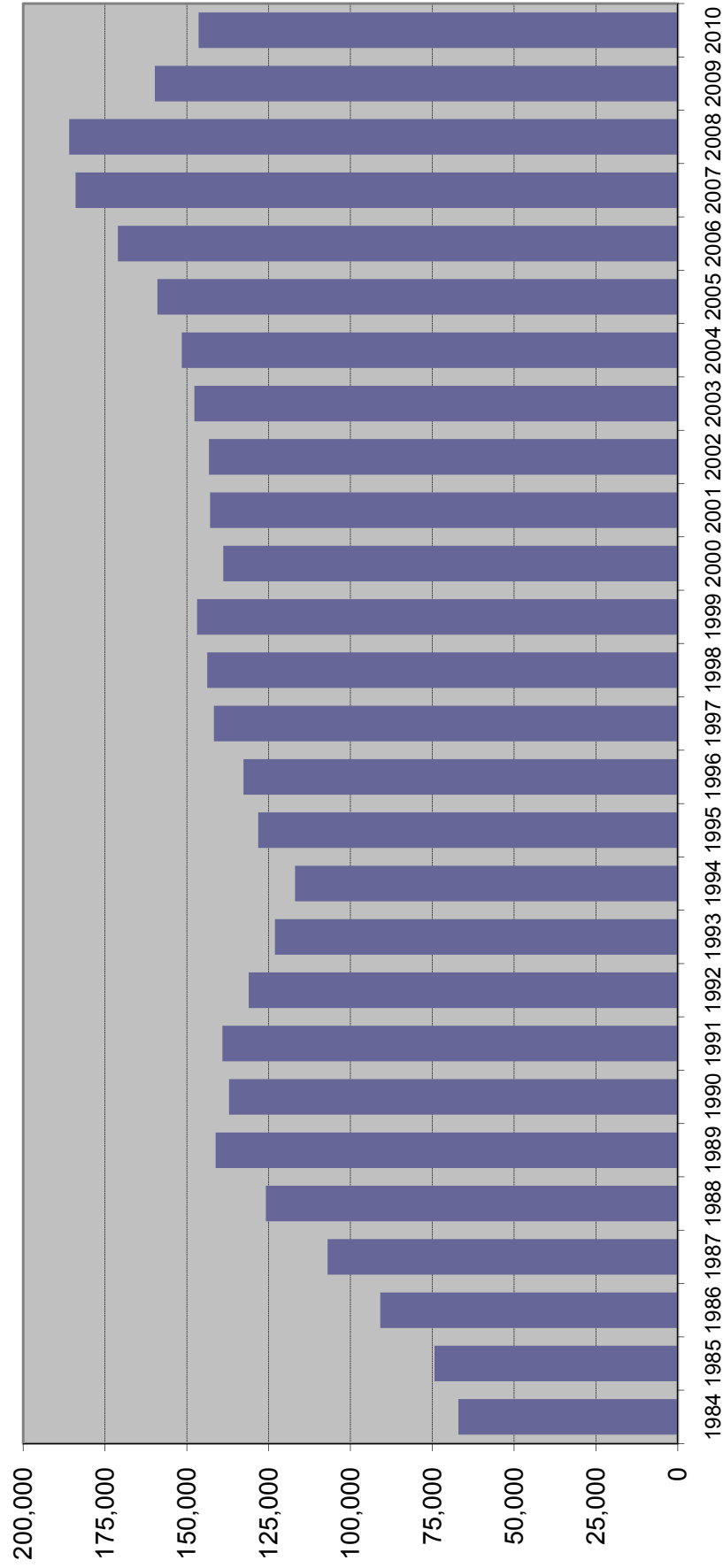

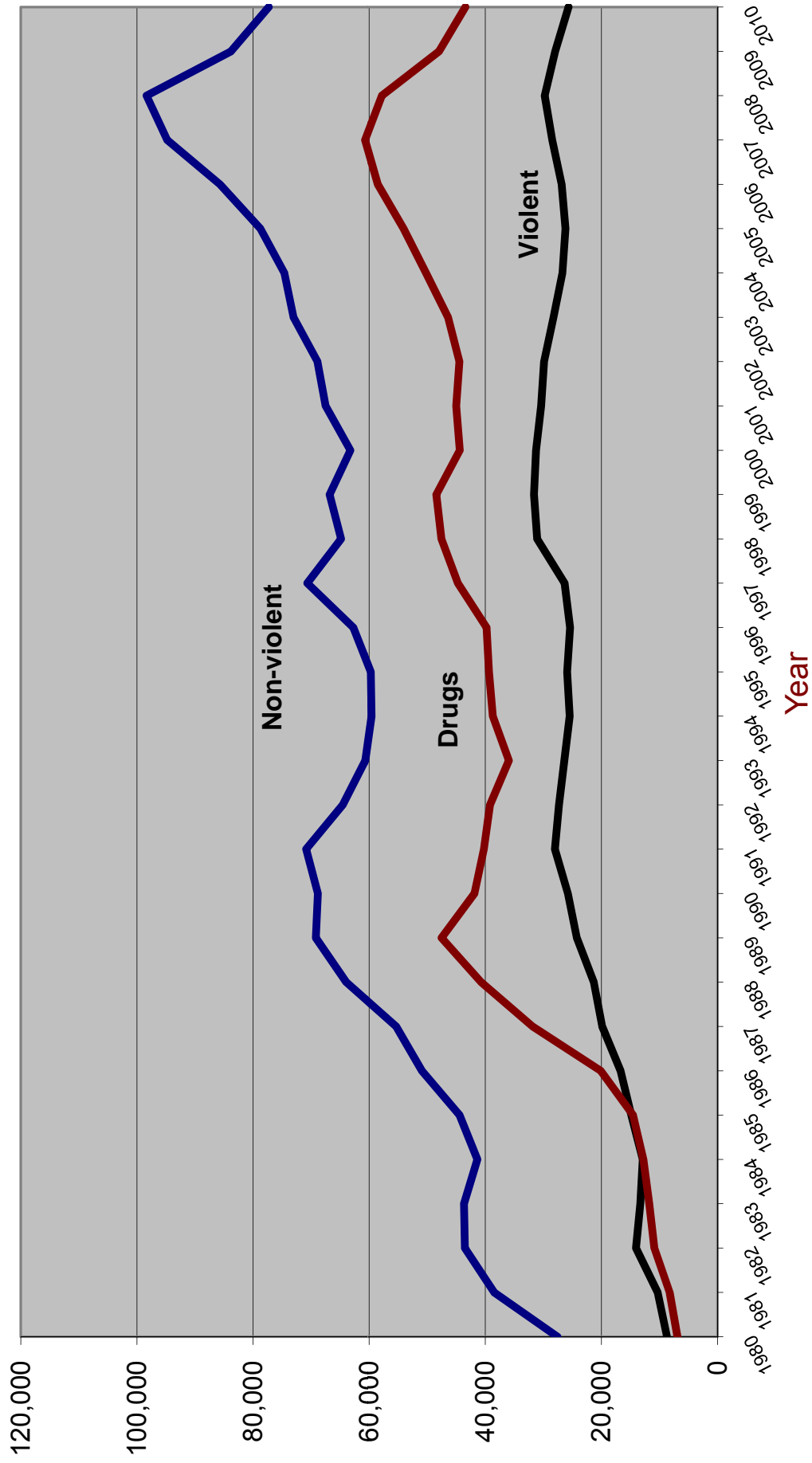

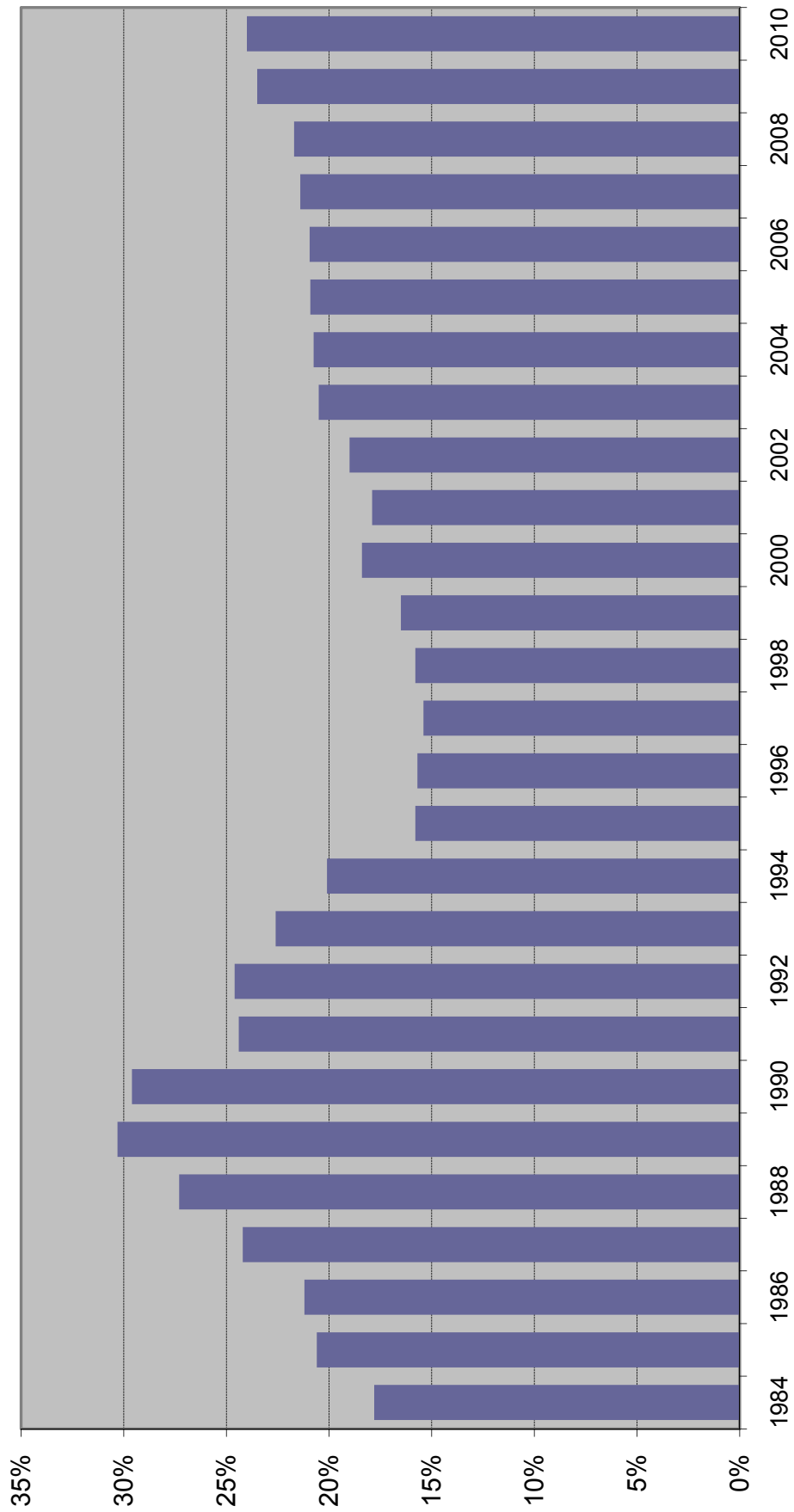

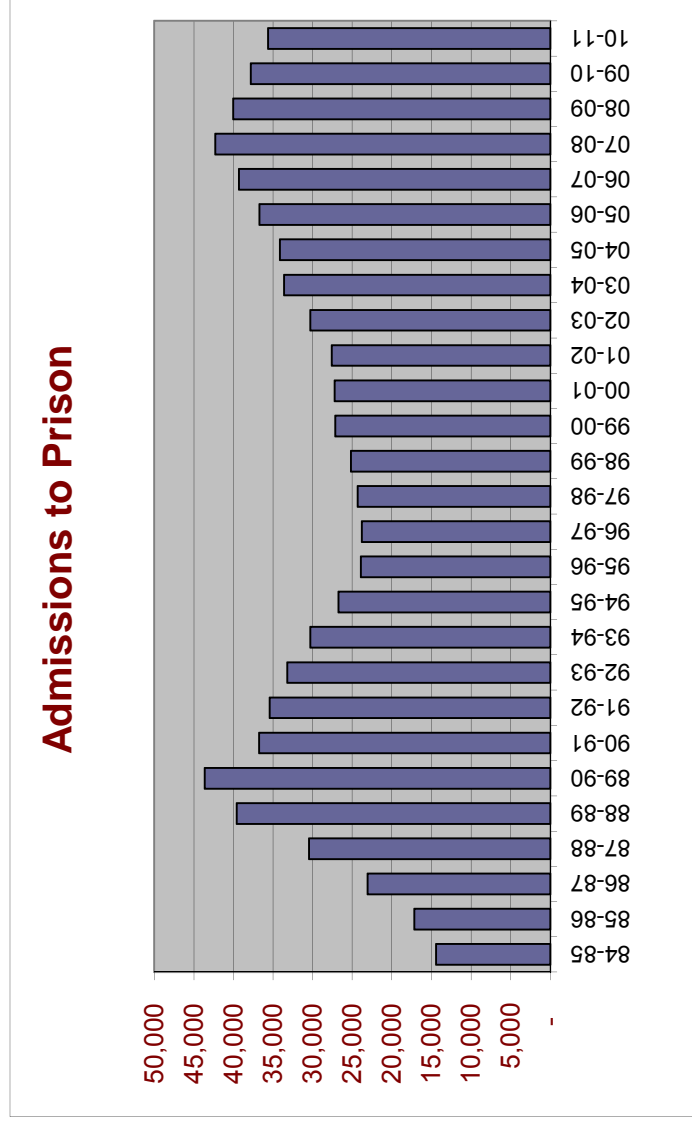

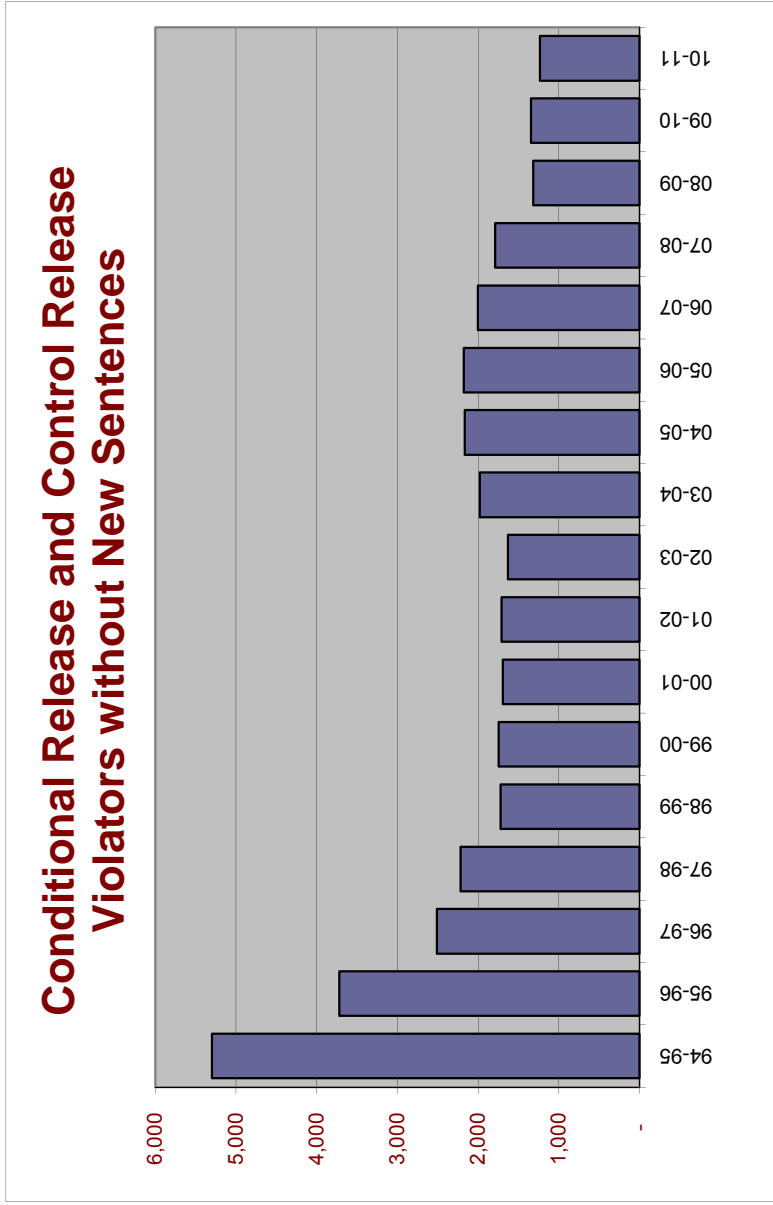

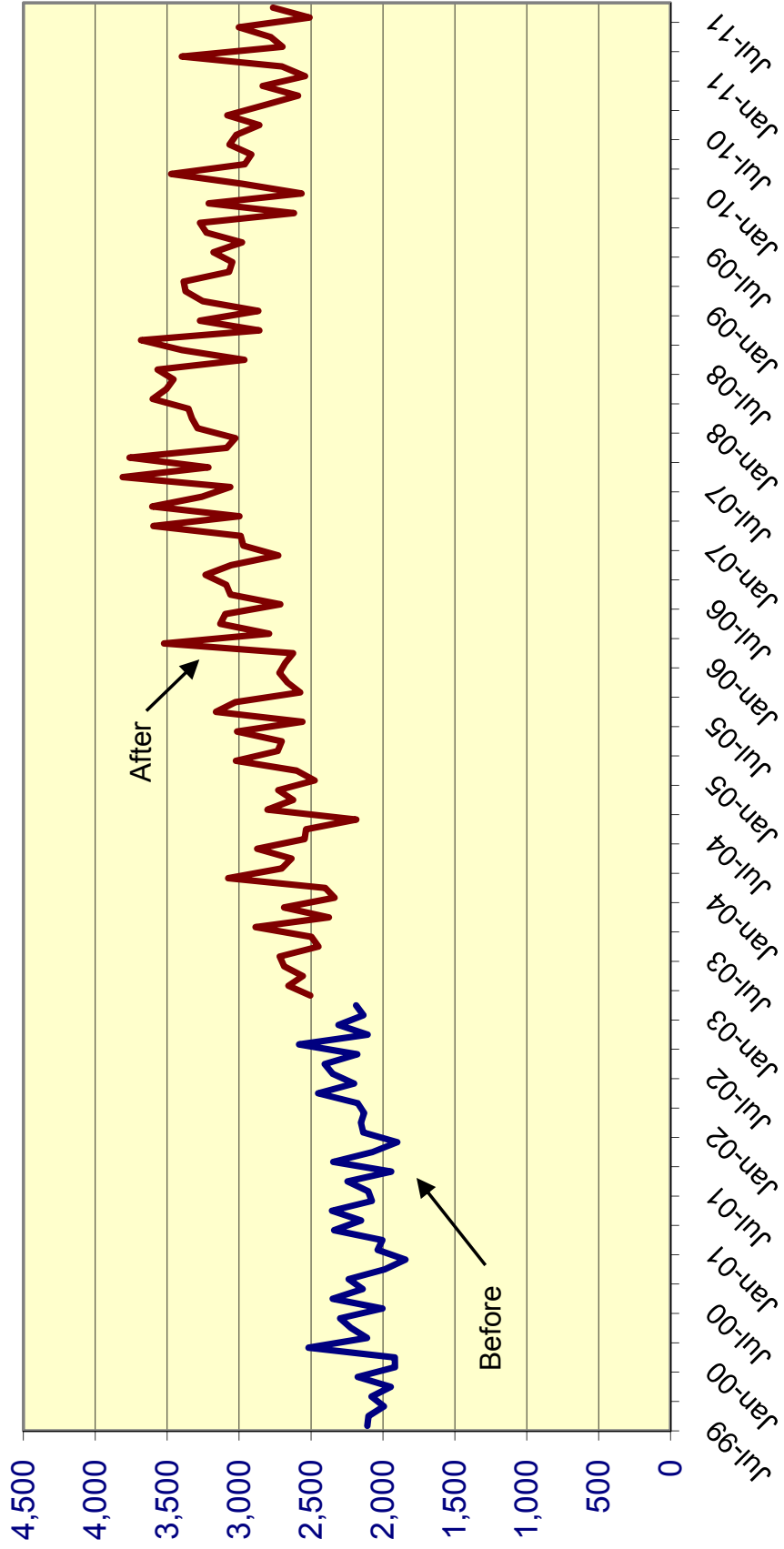

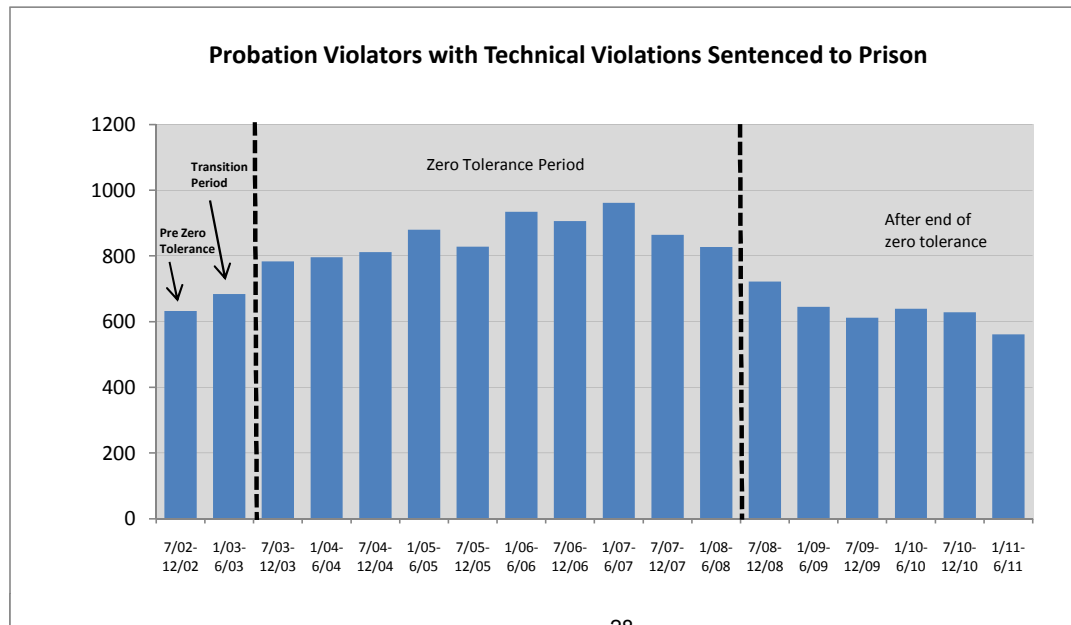

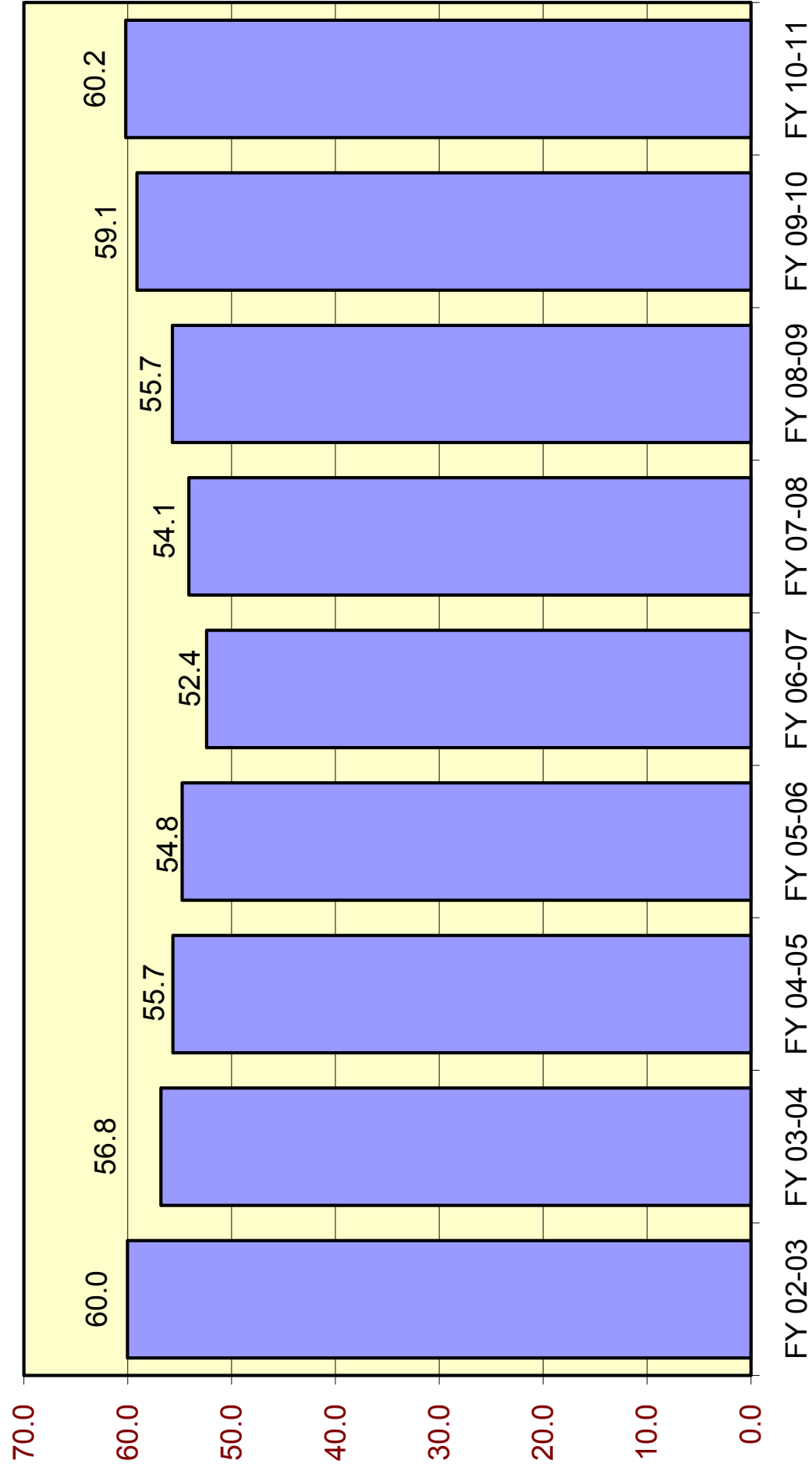

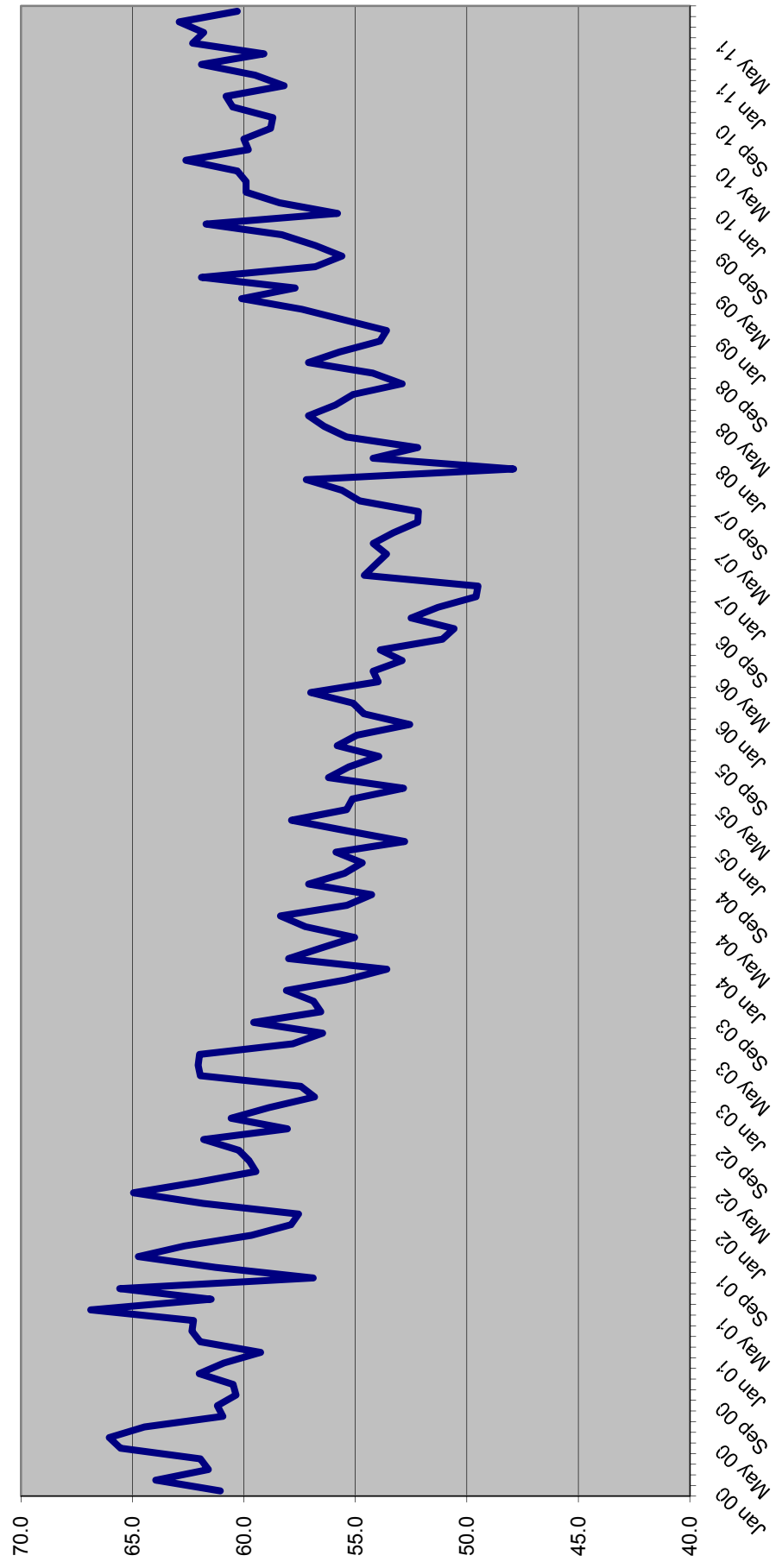
Technical Violators as % of Total Admissions before, during, and after Zero Tolerance

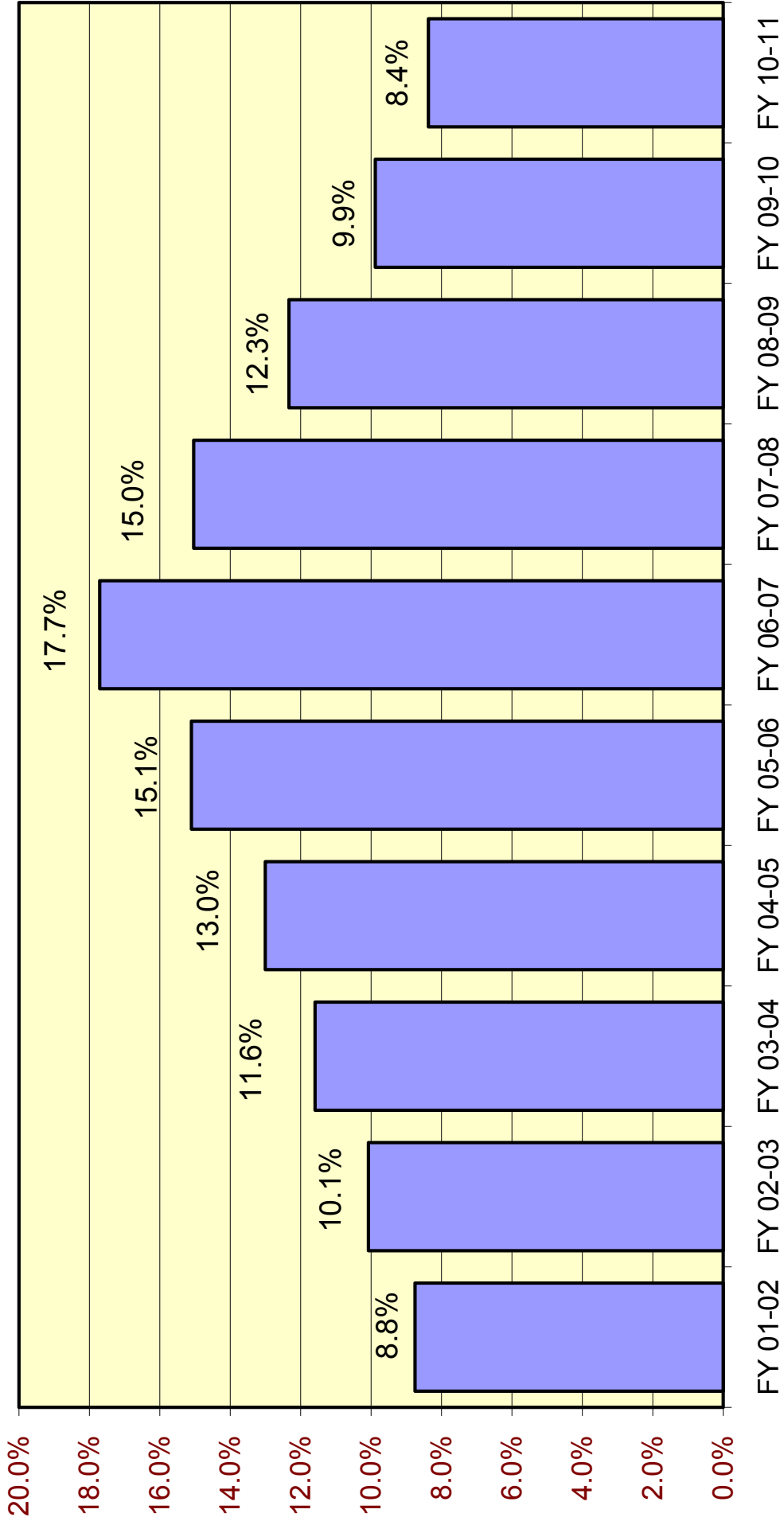

New Commitments Year- and-a-Day Sentences as Percent of All Sentences

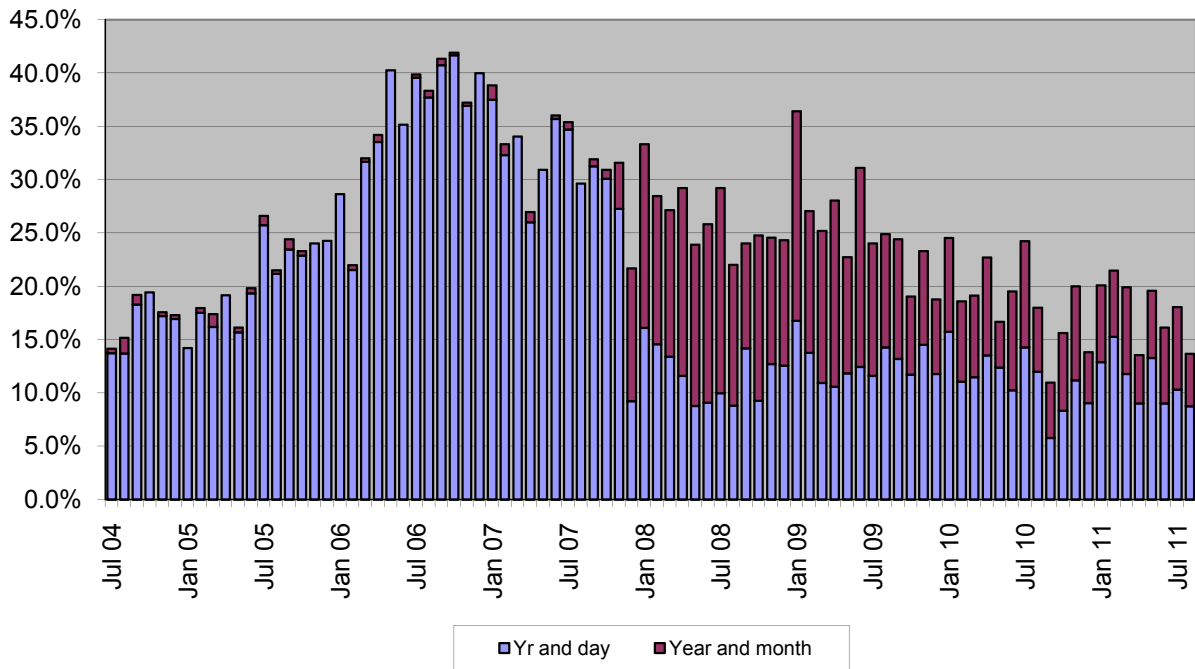

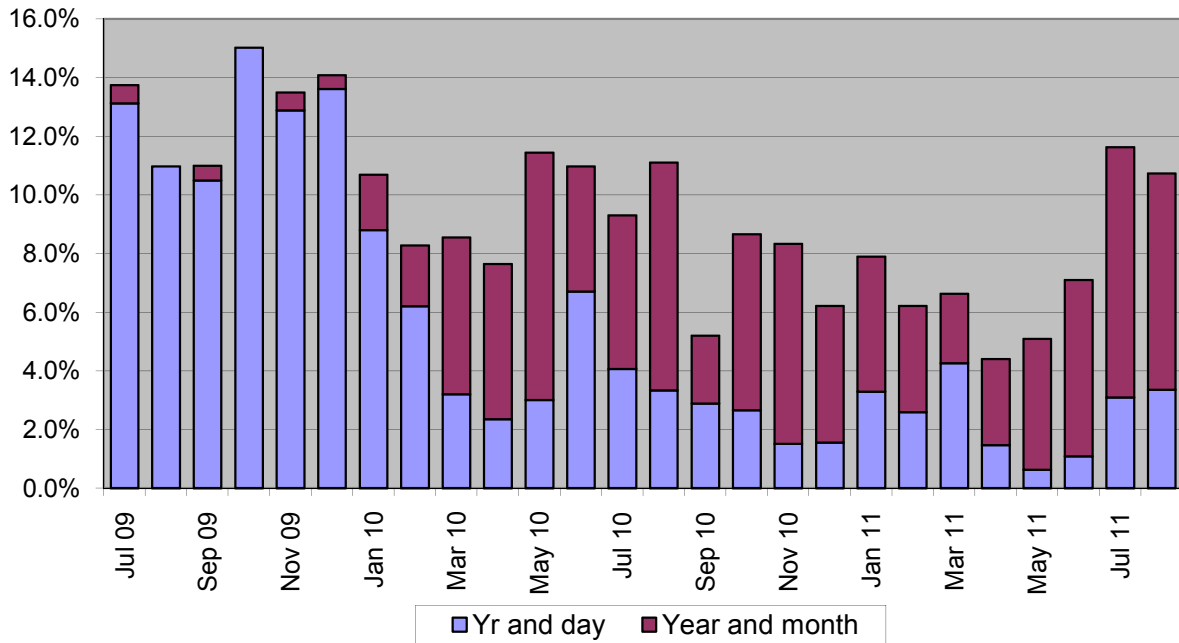

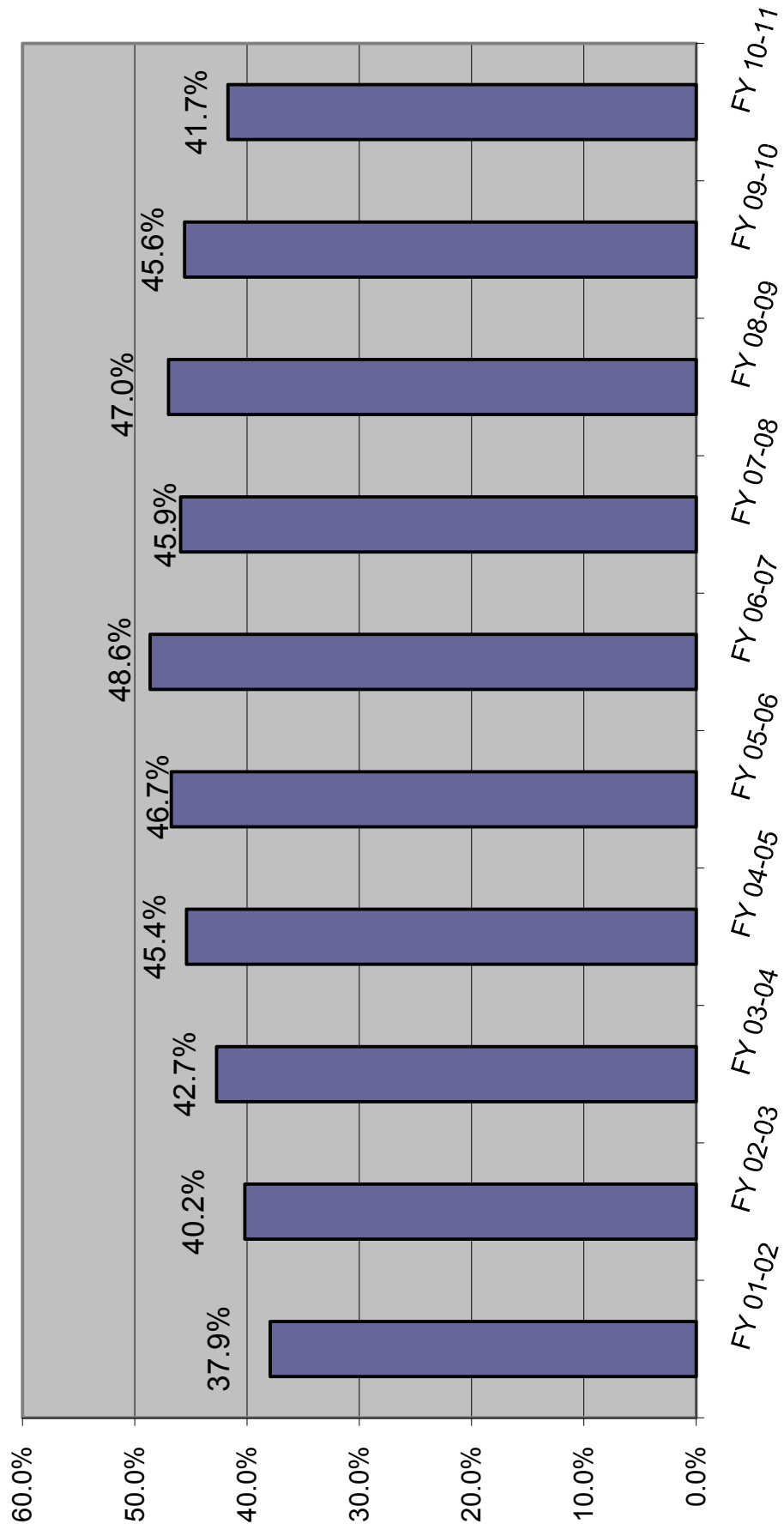

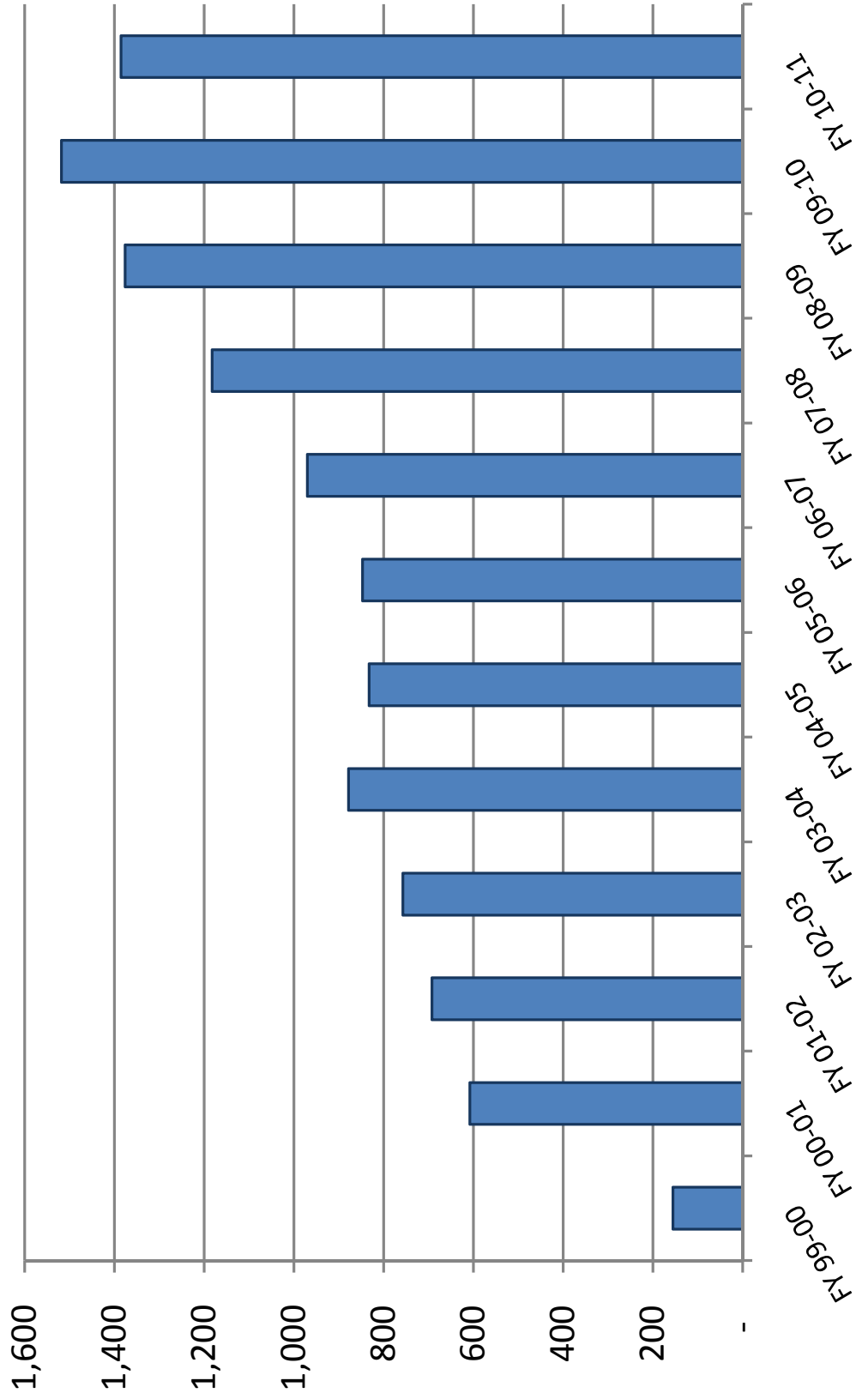

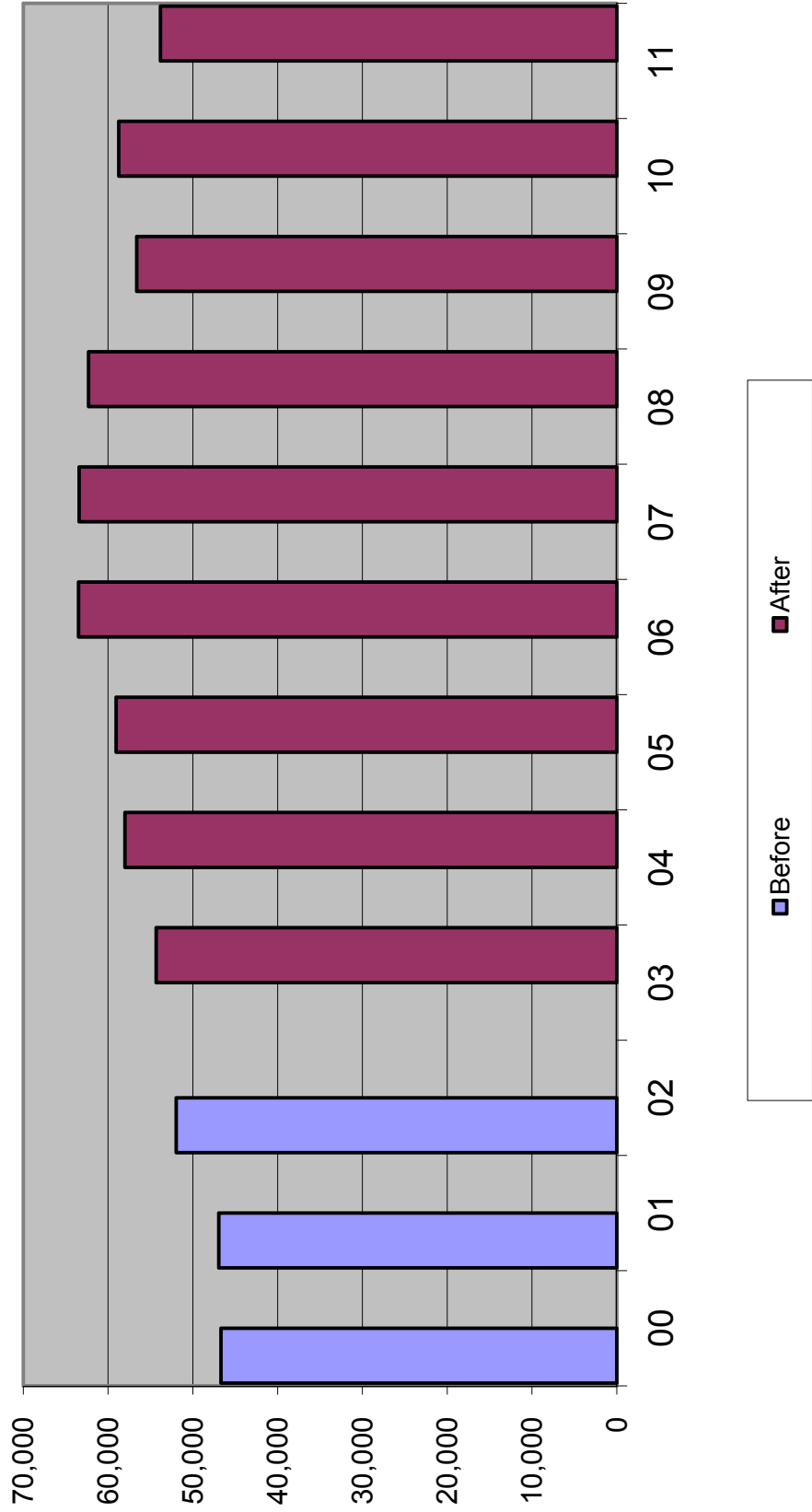

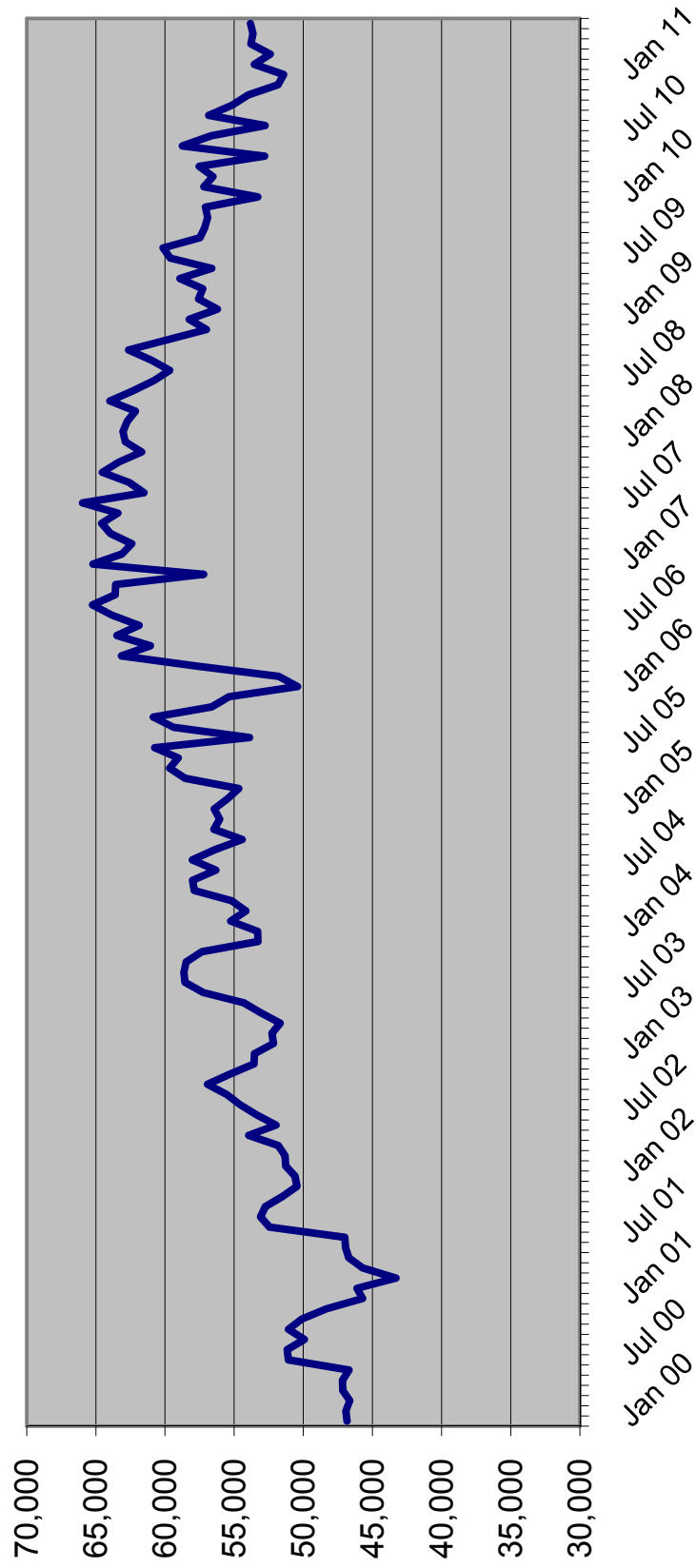

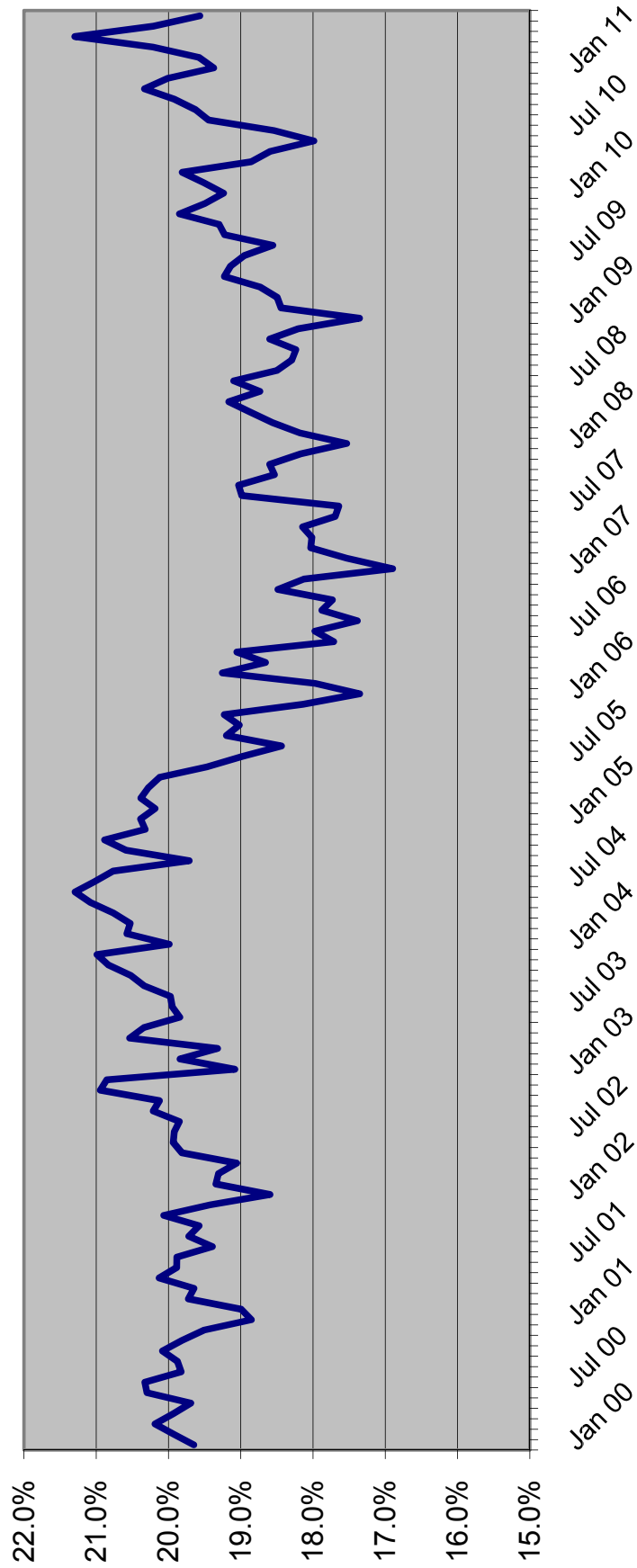
June County Jail Average Daily Population Before and After Zero Tolerance



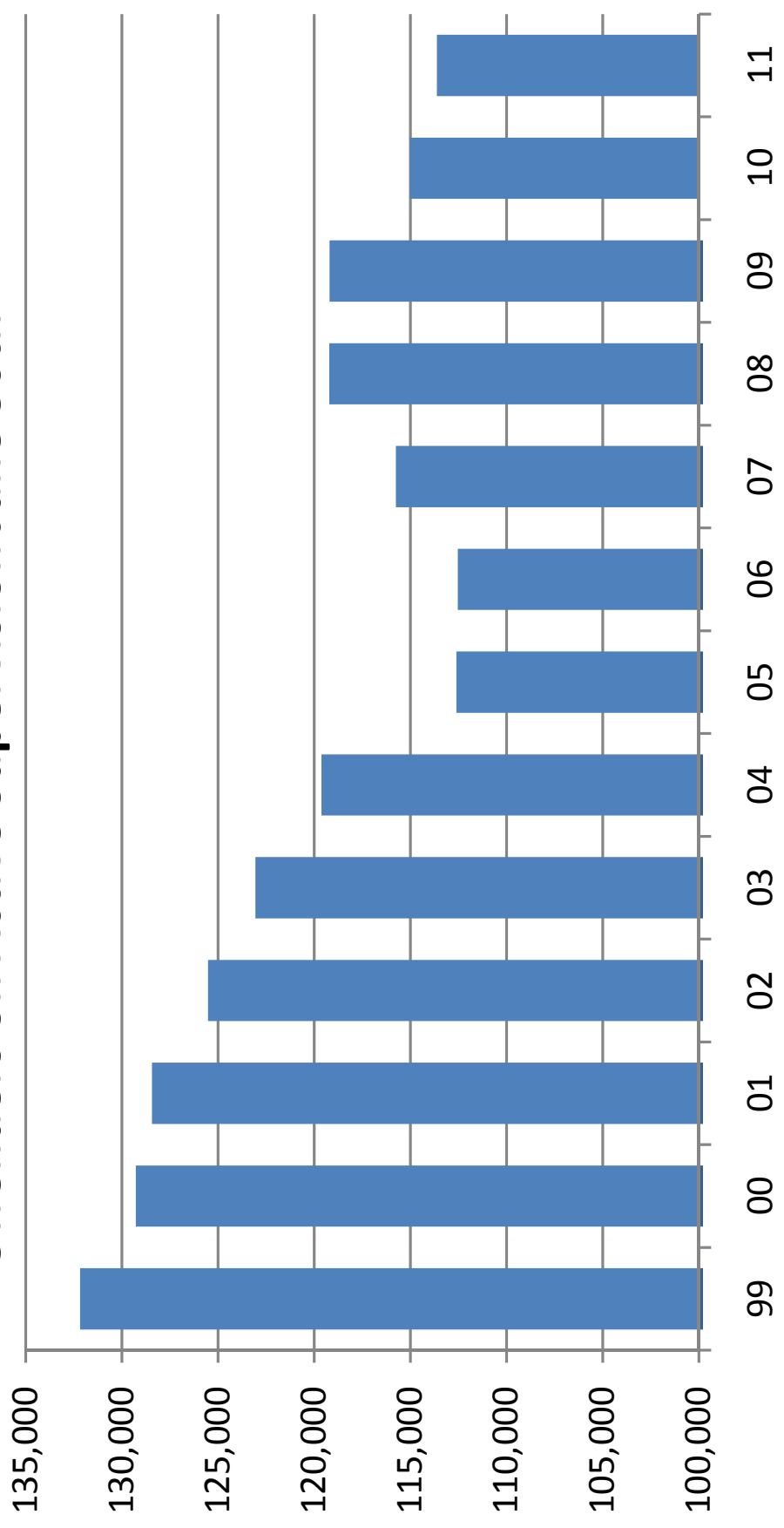
Average Daily Population in County Jails



Sentenced Felons in County Jails as % of Total Jail Population

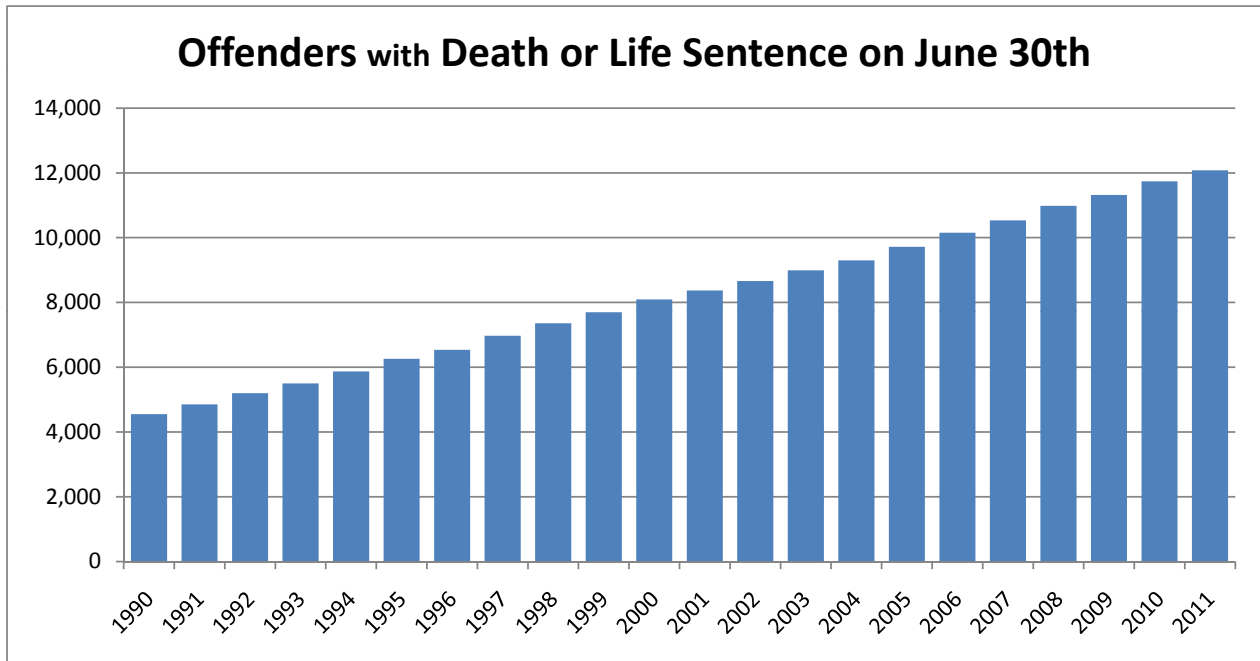


Offenders on Active Supervision June 30th

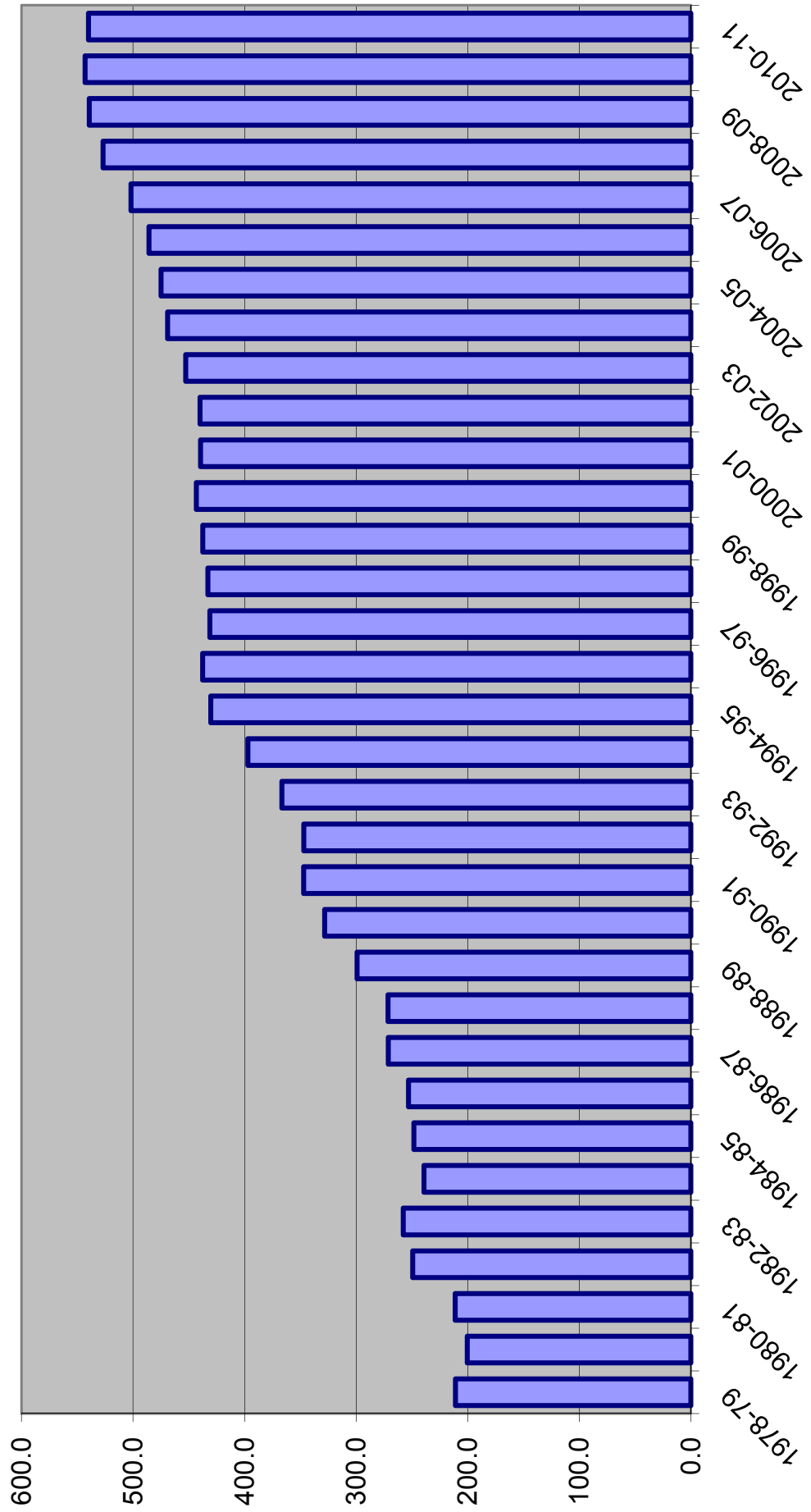

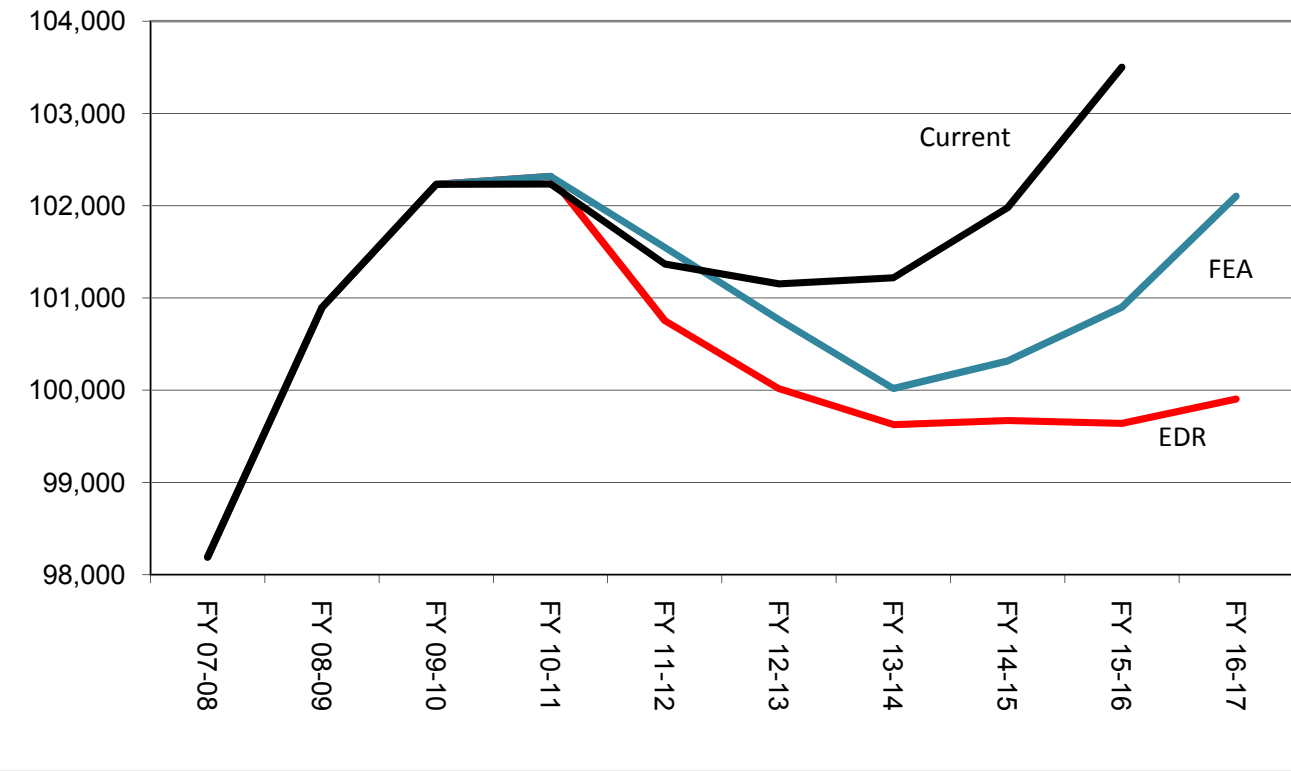
