FY 2008-09 operating costs per inmate are from the FY 08-09 Department of Corrections Annual Report . The \$52.00 per diem is for all department facilities (excluding private institutions and approximately150 beds in PRCs) and includes operations, health services, and education services. It does not include debt service costs. It also does not include indirect and administrative costs of \$3.54 per inmate (major institutions). Operating costs in future years were increased by the change in the CPI from the National Economic Estimating Conference held January 19, 2010.

FY 2006-07 capital costs per bed were based on Department of Corrections cost to build Suwanee CI (\$94,000,000 for 2,003 lawful capacity beds) as reported at the Criminal Justice Impact Conference held February 23, 2010. Capital costs in later years were increased by the change in the chained price index for state and local construction spending obtained from Global Insights, Inc.
