2/27/2015	CS/HB 133 (as amended)	<b>Sexual Offenses:</b> Designates act as "43 Days Initiative Act"; revises time limitations for criminal prosecution of specified sexual battery offenses if victim is 16 years of age or older; provides applicability. <i>Effective Date: July 1, 2015</i>	+ mod.	+ mod.	+ mod.	+ mod.	+ mod. 2/27/2015	CS HB 157 (Passed as CS/CS/HB 157)	<b>Fraud:</b> Defines "business entity"; provides for restitution for certain out-of-pocket costs of victims; requires business entities to provide copies of business records of fraudulent transactions involving identity theft to victims & law enforcement agencies in certain circumstances; includes counties & other political subdivisions in provisions prohibiting false marking of goods or packaging with location of origin; prohibits fraudulent issuance of indicia of membership interest in limited liability company; specifies that electronic statements are included in provisions prohibiting certain false representations; increases criminal penalties for fraudulently obtaining goods or services from health care provider; expands specified identity theft offenses to include all persons rather than being limited to natural persons; prohibits knowingly providing false information that becomes part of public record to facilitate or further commission of certain offenses. <i>Effective Date: October 1, 2015</i>	+ indet	+ indet	+ indet	+ indet	+ indet	YES
2/27/2015	CS HB 465 (Passed as CS/CS/HB 465)	<b>Human Trafficking:</b> Provides enhanced criminal penalties for soliciting another to commit prostitution & similar offenses; requires persons convicted of such offenses to perform community service & pay for & attend education program; requires court to impose minimum mandatory terms of incarceration for persons convicted two or more times of soliciting another to commit prostitution & similar offenses; provides for impoundment of vehicle used in soliciting another to commit prostitution & similar offenses; allows vehicle owner to prevent impoundment or immobilization in certain circumstances; provides that circuit court in circuit in which petitioner was arrested may expunge criminal history record of human trafficking victim; requires judge to allow advocate to be present with in expunction hearing in certain circumstances. <i>Effective Date: October 1, 2015</i>	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig. 2/27/2015	SB 1010 (Passed)	<b>False Personation:</b> Revises list of officials who are prohibited from being falsely personated; prohibits sale or transfer of specified badges bearing in any manner or combination words "fire department" & ownership or operation of vehicles marked or identified by words "fire department"; requires specified intent for certain offenses; provides exception. <i>Effective Date: October 1, 2015</i>	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig. 3/11/2015	CS/SB 290 (Passed as CS/CS/SB 290)	<b>Carrying a Concealed Weapon or a Concealed Firearm:</b> Provides exemption from criminal penalties for carrying concealed weapon or concealed firearm while in the act of evacuating pursuant to mandatory evacuation order during declared state of emergency; defines "in the act of evacuating." <i>Effective Date: July 1, 2015</i>	-insig.	-insig.	-insig.	-insig.	-insig. 3/11/2015	SB 538 (Passed as CS/CS/SB 538)	<b>Disclosure of Sexually Explicit Images:</b> Prohibits individual from electronically disclosing sexually explicit image of identifiable person with intent to harass such person if individual knows or should have known that such person did not consent to disclosure; providing criminal penalties; provides enhanced penalties for violations by persons 18 years of age or older involving victims younger than 16 years of age; provides exceptions; exempts providers of specified services; requires court to order that person convicted of violation be prohibited from having contact with victim & requires penalties for violation of order run consecutively to penalties for original violation. <i>Effective Date: October 1, 2015</i>	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig. 3/11/2015	HB 897 (Passed as CS/HB 897)	<b>Controlled Substances:</b> Adds certain substances to Schedule I list of controlled substances; reenacts provisions. <i>Effective Date: October 1, 2015</i>	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	YES
3/11/2015	HB 7021 (Passed as CS/HB 7021)	<b>Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission:</b> Revises provisions relating to implementation of alligator management & trapping program; tarpon tags; issuance of restricted species endorsements on saltwater products licenses; dealers & buyers of hides & furs; taking of alligators or their eggs; alligator trapping license requirements & fees; alligator hide validation tags; revenues for alligator husbandry research; transfer of funds from alligator management program to General Inspection Trust Fund for specified purposes; limiting tags available for alligators taken under collection permit; & penalties for feeding of wildlife & freshwater fish; repeals provisions relating to alligator trapping program, alligator study requirements, unlawful sale of alligator products, & products derived or made from skins of crocodilia. <i>Effective Date: Upon becoming law.</i>	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig. 4/1/2015	CS/HB 1127 (Passed as CS/CS/HB 1127)	<b>Insurance Fraud:</b> Revises health care clinic's exemption from certain insurance reimbursement requirements; repeals provisions relating to operation or reporting of unlicensed health care clinics; revises responsibilities of health care clinic; provides penalties; revises & provides penalties for certificate of exemption requirements; requires AHCA to adopt rules; requires certain clinics to have certificate of exemption to receive reimbursement under Florida Motor Vehicle No-Fault Law; revises insurance fraud detection requirements for insurers; requires insurers to establish insurance fraud special investigative units; provides requirements & penalties for such units; requires Citizens Property Insurance Corporation & HMOs to comply with certain insurance fraud detection provisions; repeals provisions relating to establishment of motor vehicle insurance fraud DSO; conforms provisions. <i>Effective Date: July 1, 2015</i>	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.	+ insig.
