The Public Schools PK-12 Education Estimating Conference met to review recommended adjustments to the Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) student enrollments adopted on February 6, 2008. There were two types of adjustments recommended: 1) adjustments due to an error in including grade 12 nonpromoted students as an input for the software school districts use to develop their forecasts and 2) a decrease for a Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) facility. The conference approved all recommended adjustments.

The changes reduce the total PK-12 total forecast for 2008-09 by 1,076.88 FTE students with 25 of the decrease for the DJJ FTE reduction. See the table below for the changes by grade and by program.
