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Revised General Revenue Collections for November 2012 (Sales Tax Data Reported is Unaudited)

General Revenue (GR) collections for November 2012 were \$10.3 M over the estimates adopted by the General Revenue Estimating Conference (GR REC) on August 9, 2012.

After making adjustments to total Sales Tax collections for local taxes and distributions, audits, bad checks, and transfers to Sales Tax from the Communications Services Tax (CST), Sales Tax GR was \$2.3 M over estimate—or well less than the plus or minus 1% that forms the range typically considered noise. Final Sales Tax Liability, the sum of all sales tax components (detailed below), was over estimate by a total of \$20.5 M or 1.4%.

Five of the Sales Tax collection components were over estimate for November, and one was under estimate. The components that came in over estimate were: Tourism (over by \$2.3 M or 0.7%); Automobiles (over by \$1.7 M or 0.7%); Other Durables (over by \$3.1 M or 3.2%); Building (over by \$5.7 M or 6.9%); and, Business (over by \$9.0 M or 3.1%). Consumer Nondurables was the only component under estimate (by \$1.5 M or 0.3%). Note that this Sales Tax report largely reflects activity that actually occurred in October

Several additional sources were over estimate for November. The largest overage was in Corporate Income Taxes (over by \$32.7 M); however, \$19.5 M of that overage was from audit assessments. The second largest gain was related to Service Charges which was over by \$16.6 M. This overage reflects the receipt of revenue originally expected in October and offsets a similar sized underage from that month. Other sources over estimate include Documentary Stamp Tax (over by \$9.9 M), Other Nonoperating Revenues (over by \$5.1M) and Intangibles Taxes (over by \$4.6 M).

Of sources coming in under estimate for November, the largest was Beverage Taxes (under by \$7.6 M largely due to \$6.2 M more in Scholarship Tax Credits being used than expected). Other sources coming in below their estimates include Insurance Premium Taxes (under by \$2.7M) and Highway Safety Fees (under by \$1.6 M).

Refunds were over by \$50.3M in total mainly as a result of a timing error in the processing of corporate income tax refunds—compare November's overage to the shortfall of \$52.5 in October. November's Corporate Income refunds (over by \$50.2 M) accounted for the vast majority of the overage while the other three categories combined account for the remainder of the overage. Since refunds reduce revenue, coming in over the estimate in Refunds decreases bottom-line Net GR.

In summary, Net GR collections were \$10.3 M over estimate for November and \$260.2 M over estimate year to date. The figures in the table below show the variance from monthly estimates that are based on the results of the August 9, 2012 estimating conference.
