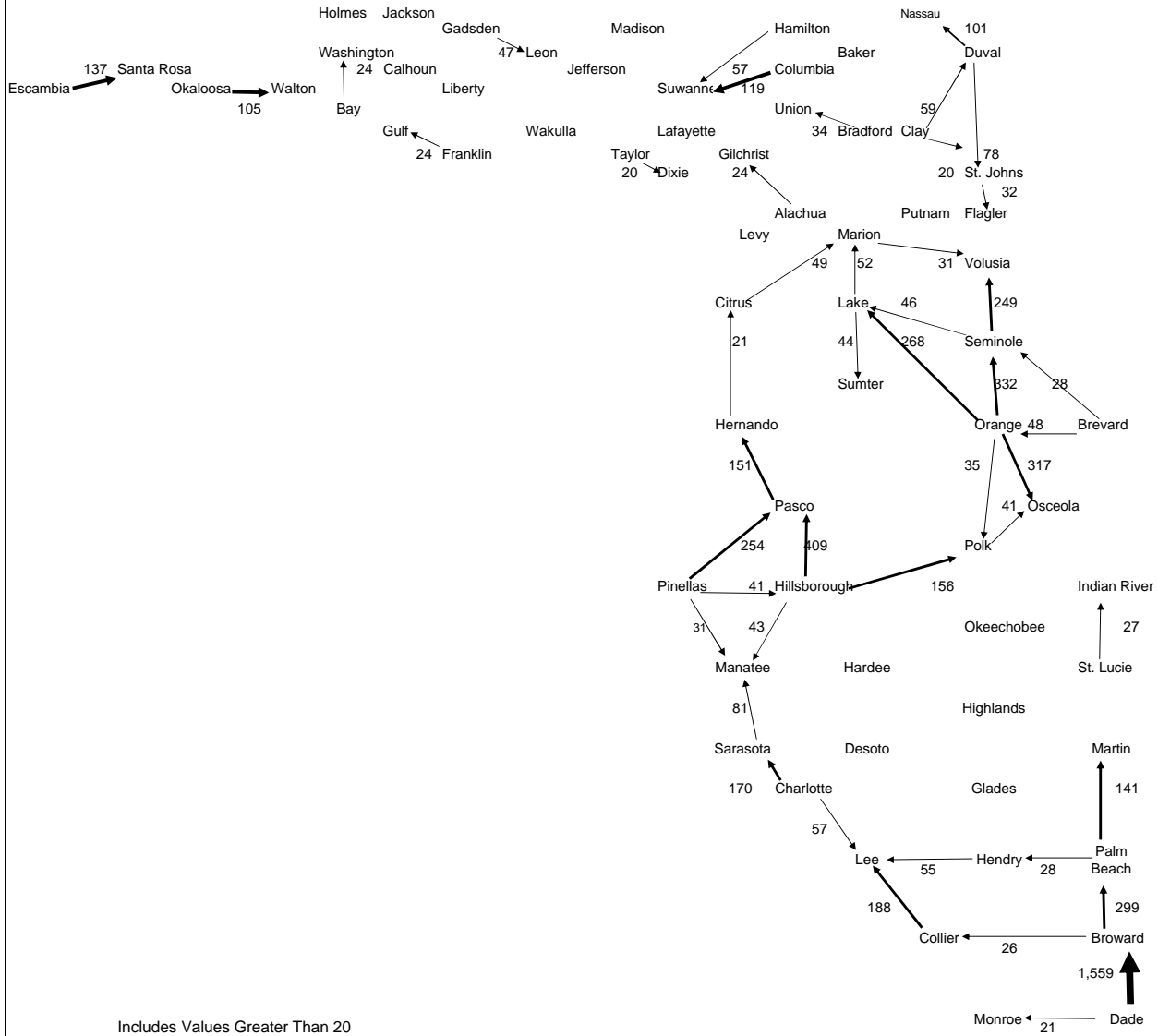

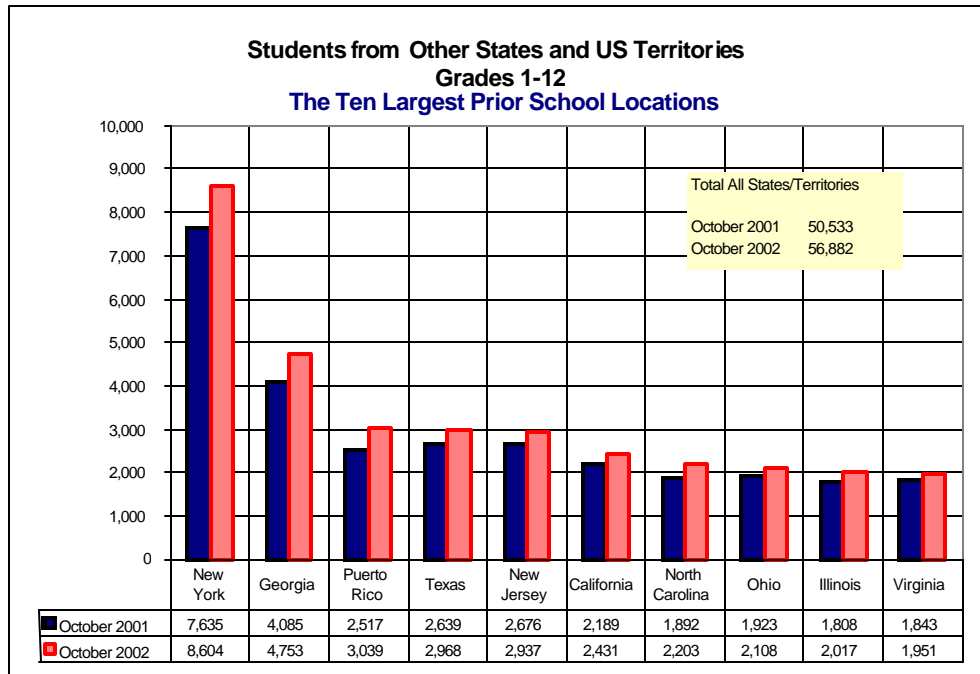

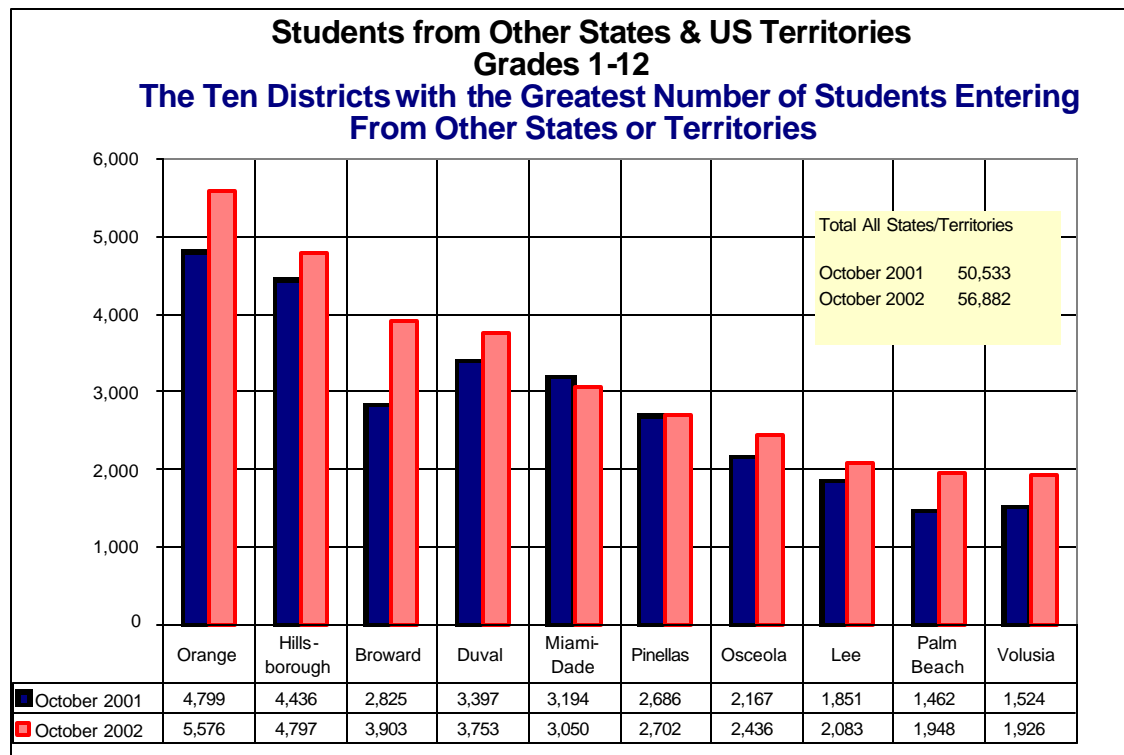
- Other U.S. states & territories are the largest source of new students in grades 1-12. Over twice as many students come from the US (other than Florida) than come from other countries.

New York and Georgia have been the most common prior location for both the October 2001 and October 2002 surveys. The figure below shows the origin for the 10 greatest prior school locations.



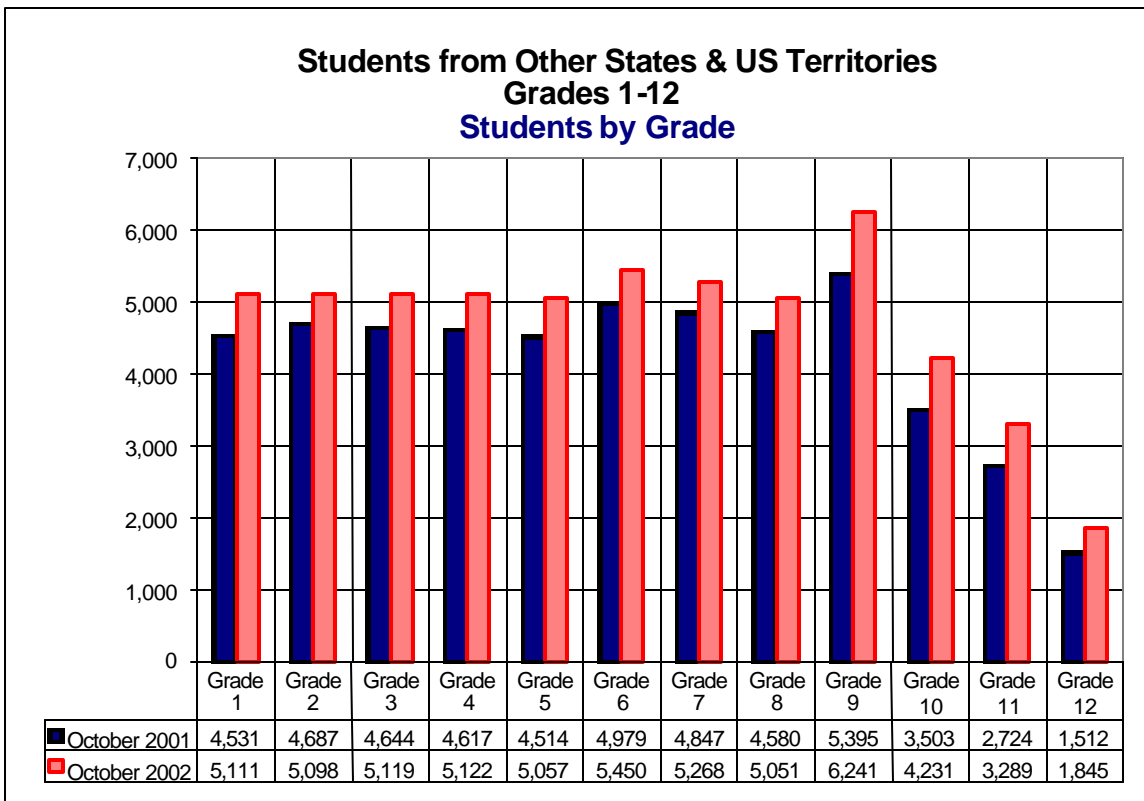
■ School Districts Receiving the Most Students from Other U.S. States & Territories

- About twice as many New York students entered Orange School District as entered Hillsborough School District.

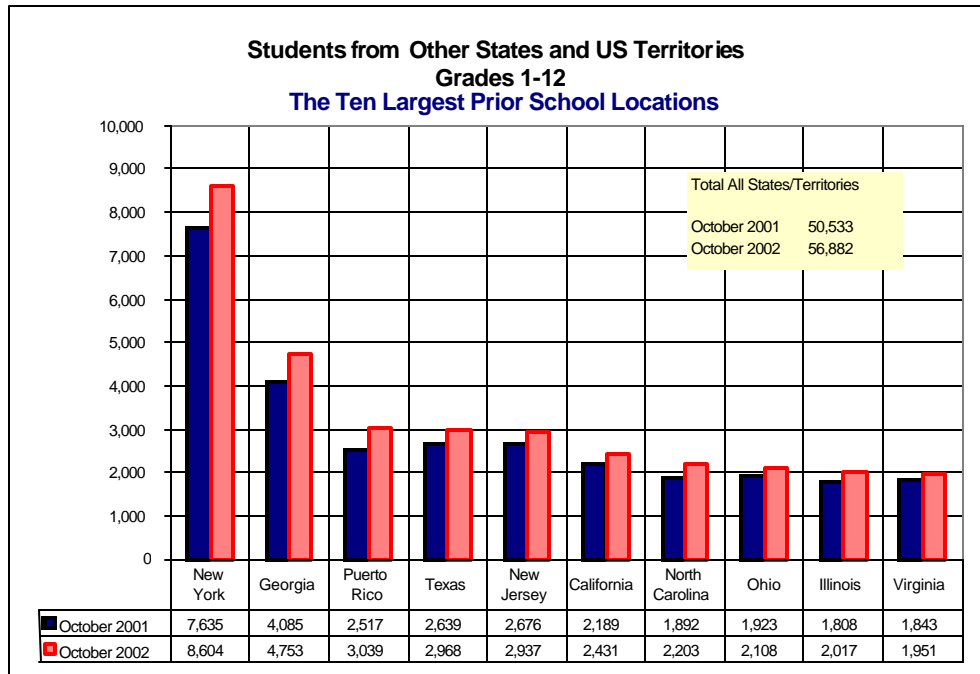
Students Entering Florida Public Schools From Other U.S. States & Territories

Grades 1-12

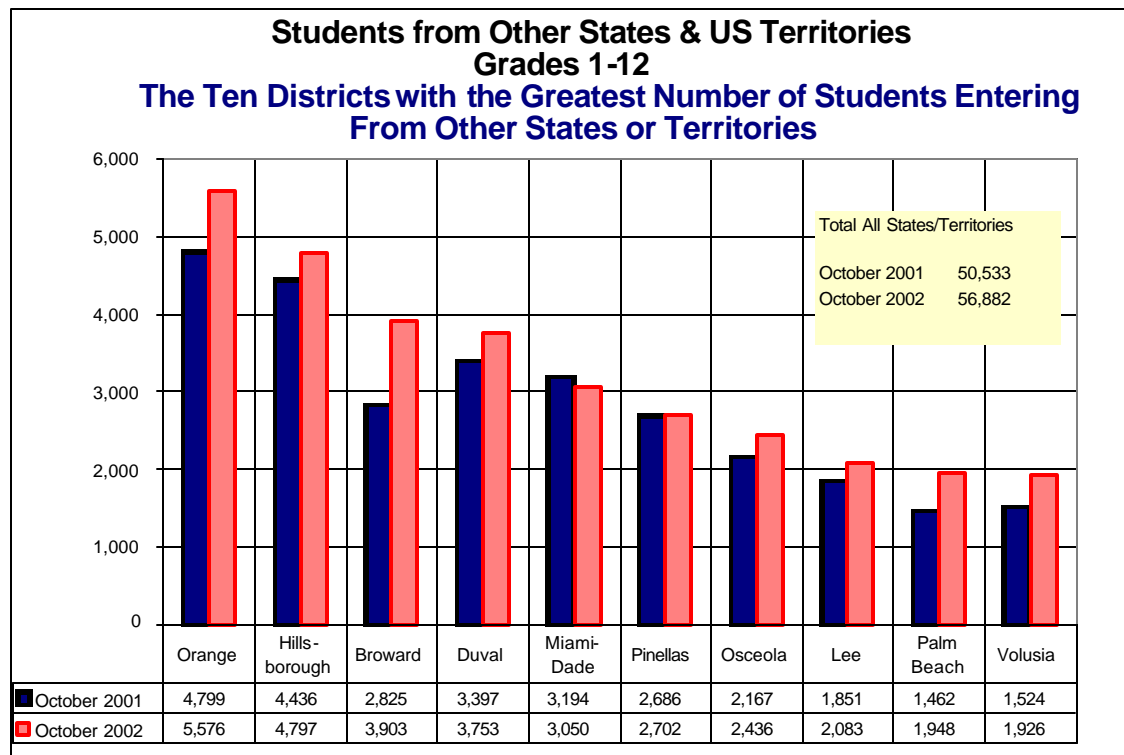
- Other U.S. states & territories are the largest source of new students in grades 1-12. Over twice as many students come from the US (other than Florida) than come from other countries.

New York and Georgia have been the most common prior location for both the October 2001 and October 2002 surveys. The figure below shows the origin for the 10 greatest prior school locations.



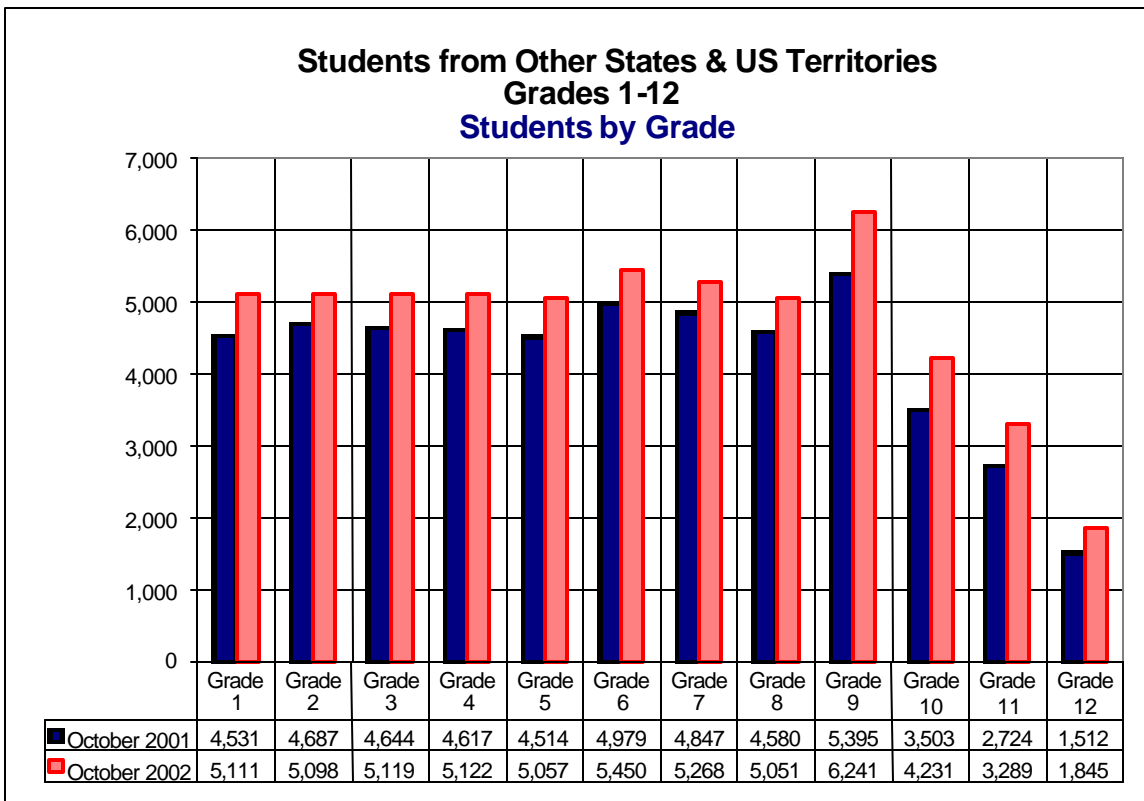
■ School Districts Receiving the Most Students from Other U.S. States & Territories

- In both the October 2001 and October 2002 surveys, Orange, Hillsborough, and Duval school districts received more students from other states and territories than did the Miami-Dade school district.
- Broward School District had the largest change in the number of students, gaining more than 1,000 students in October 2002 than it had received in October 2001. This increase is not due to any one particular state or territory.
- About twice as many New York students entered Orange School District as entered Hillsborough School District.



■ Grade Level Distribution of Entering Students

More students enter Florida schools from other states & territories in the ninth grade than in any other grade. The second highest entry grade is the sixth grade. These two grades are typically the first year in high school and middle school respectively.
